Happy New Year!!

I'm delighted to tell you that we will not be closing next school year. The School Board has decided to keep 5 of the 6 schools proposed for closing open. We are relieved and look forward to continuing to teach your children and to build our community.

We have had 7 snow days thus far this school year. This is unprecedented and we anticipate changes to the school calendar later to make up missed days. Our current school calendar provides for 2 snow days while still meeting the state's requirement of 170 student days per school year. We anticipate that we will receive information from the superintendent later this month on how we will make up the other 5 days. We have a plan to have Zoom sessions on any other snow days this year.

Here are the things you can expect from our school staff during future school closures.

- An email will be sent to parents in the morning outlining the schedule and the lessons to be completed at home.
- Teachers will provide a link to Zoom meetings that students may attend if they have access to a computer. These Zoom Meetings will be available, but not required.
- Teachers will be available by email throughout the snow day to address your questions.

We will begin a reward system for students with good attendance this semester. More information will be sent home later this week. It is very important for students to come to school on time each day as reading/math lessons begin shortly after morning announcements. Absent and late students have a difficult time keeping up with their peers because they miss lessons and information that the rest of the class have received. There are guidelines for sick students in previous newsletters, but please bring students to school by 8:50am. Again, Happy New Year!!








Happy New Year!


