SCHOOL LOST AND FOUND

CANNED FOOD DRIVE

Help Families in Need in Our Community

Klatt Elementary Student Council is organizing a food drive to meet a community need for Food Bank of Alaska from November 4 through December 6th. Every 1.2 pounds of food we collect is the equivalent of a meal for one person. Student Council will collect donated items from the classrooms each morning and then place them in the red collection bins near the office. Most wanted food items are:

- Canned produce—vegetables, tomato sauce, fruit packed in water or light syrup
- Dried fruits
- Dried meats and beans
- Whole grains—quinoa, rice, pasta
- Cereal—low sugar, instant oatmeal
- Prepared meals—low sodium soups, pop top meals for kids, kid friendly healthy snacks
- Canned proteins—tuna, chicken
- Nuts and nut butters
- Milks—powdered and shelf stable

Healthy Futures Challenge

At the beginning of September information on the Healthy Futures Challenge was given to students. The program encourages children to be more active and make healthy choices to promote better physical health. An important step of the challenge is remembering to fill out the Healthy Futures log. When your student is active, it should be recorded on the log that was sent home (as seen below). If your student is active 15 days a month for at least 60 minutes, they are eligible to get a prize and also a raffle ticket to put their name in for a grand prize for three months' participation. The challenge runs the months of September, October and November.

October logs are due on November 6th.

November logs will be due on December 7th.

HOW SICK IS TOO SICK?

Children are too sick to come to school:

- When they are contagious and/or
- When their symptoms are serious enough to prevent them from focusing on the tasks they need to do at school.

Please keep your child home from school and consider seeking medical attention if:

- Your child has a persistent, phlegmy cough
- Your child has diarrhea
- Your child has a fever above 101° F
- Your child has a stomach ache accompanied by fever, vomiting, diarrhea, pain, or a hard belly
- Your child has a sore throat with fever, headache, stomach ache, or swollen glands
- Your child's eyes are crusty, bright red, and/or are discharging yellow or green fluid
- Your child has a rash that is undiagnosed so could be contagious

Keep your child home until he or she has been symptom free for at least 24 hours or until a doctor indicates that he/she can return to school. If your child has a cold, headache, or stomach ache that is NOT accompanied by fever, vomiting or diarrhea, he/she is welcome to come to school. Children should come to school as long as they can concentrate on their work.

Reading Buddies

Our Reading Buddies program at Klatt pairs sixth graders with kindergartners once a month in the library. This program promotes a higher interest and engagement in reading, improves social and communication skills, and, most importantly, it's just FUN!

Both our younger and older students benefit in so many ways. Our sixth graders gain confidence in helping others with literacy and educational growth. They feel good about having younger students admire them and look up to them. Our kindergartners benefit from hearing stories read aloud and the modeling of reading fluency, phrasing and expression. They enjoy having conversations with an older student about topics that interest them which helps them extend their vocabulary and oral language abilities.
