Please welcome the following new staff members to our school



Attendance is a focus for the Anchorage School District and at Klatt Elementary School

Last year, students were at school 94.21% of the time. Our goal is to increase our overall attendance to 95%. By increasing to 95% our school will reduce 539 days students are away from school. Our school also has a goal to increase the number of students with 90% attendance. Last year 70 students missed more than 10% of their days enrolled. We recognize that no parent keeps their child away from school because they want them to miss school. There are many barriers that prevent students from coming to school. The staff at Klatt are committed to helping improve attendance by welcoming students, praising them for all the good things they do, and modeling the importance of attending school. We also want to reach out and offer support to families that need it. Last year the total number of days attended by our students was 64,492. This is an impressive number, but there is still room to improve. Our classrooms are tracking every day that 95% of the students are present. Four classrooms already had 10 days of attendance. Thank you for your support at home to help Klatt Elementary School reach 95% attendance this year.

Again, welcome back to Klatt Elementary!

Este año ha sido un gran comienzo. Los estudiantes han estado haciendo un trabajo maravilloso en su salón de clase. Nuestro personal docente ha estado trabajando arduamente para poner en marcha sus clases. La primera parte del año es un tiempo para que los estudiantes y maestros se conozcan.

LA ASISTENCIA DIARA a la escuela es el enfoque para el Distrito Escolar de Anchoragey también para la Escuela Primaria Klatt.

El año pasado, los estudiantes asistieron a la escuela el 94.21% del tiempo. Nuestro objetivo es aumentar nuestra asistencia general al 95%. Al aumentar al 95%, nuestra escuela reducirá 539 días de los estudiantes que no asisten a la escuela. Nuestra escuela también tiene la meta de aumentar el número de estudiantes con un 90% de asistencia. El año pasado 70 estudiantes perdieron más del 10% de sus días de escuela. Reconocemos que ningún padre mantiene a su hijo fuera de la escuela porque quieren que falte a la escuela. Hay muchas barreras que impiden que los estudiantes vengan a la escuela. El personal de Klatt está comprometido a ayudar a mejorar la asistencia dando la bienvenida a los estudiantes, elogiándolos por todas las cosas buenas que hacen y modelando la importancia de asistir a la escuela. También queremos acercarnos y ofrecer apoyo a las familias que lo necesiten. El año pasado, el número total de días atendidos por nuestros estudiantes fue de 64,492. Este es un número impresionante, pero aún hay que mejorar. Nuestros salones de clases chequean todos los días que el 95% de los estudiantes esten presentes. Cuatro aulas ya tienen 10 días de asistencia. Gracias por su apoyo y por ayudar a que la Escuela Klatt alcance el 95% de asistencia este año.

ASD Attendance Policy

Attendance is taken twice a day **AM Attendance**:

- School starts at 9:00 AM
- Students who arrive between 9:00 AM and 10:00 AM will be marked *tardy*
- Students will be marked *absent* for one-half day if the student misses more than 60 minutes between 9:00 AM and 12:15 PM

PM Attendance:

- PM attendance starts at 12:15 PM
- Students who arrive between 12:15 PM and 1:15 PM will be marked *tardy*
- Students will be marked *absent* for one-half day if more than 60 minutes of school is missed between 12:15 and 3:30 PM

Reporting student absences

When you know your child is going to be absent:

- Call the Attendance Line 742-5750 *before* 10:00 AM
 - At the prompt **press 1** then list your student's full name, the teacher's name and grade, and reason for absence

If your call comes in *after* 10:30 AM, you will receive an automated call from the school district letting you know that your child has been marked absent.

Requesting early dismissal

If your family has a scheduled change and you need to get a message to your child during the school day, please call the office *no later than 3:10 PM*. We will do our best to get the message to your student.

🖝 Car drop off and pick-up

Parents are able to drop off/pick up their students either in the car pick-up lane or, if extra time is needed with your child during this process, you may park in the parking lot. The car pick-up line needs to be safe and efficient. Handicapped spaces are for designated handicapped drivers. Thanks for your cooperation.

Breakfast and lunch program

Breakfast and lunch menus are available at www.asdk12.org/studentnutrition We are pleased to inform you that Klatt Elementary will be participating in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program for the 2018-2019 school year. The CEP program is part of the National School Lunch and Breakfast program which allows schools with a higher percentage of low income families access to free healthy breakfasts and lunches. All enrolled students at Klatt are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at Klatt at no cost to you or your household. Your child will be able to participate without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application.

How Sick is <u>Too</u> Sick for School?

In general, children are too sick to come to school when they are contagious or their symptoms are serious enough to prevent them from focusing on the tasks they need to do at school. If you answer *yes* to any of the following questions, please keep your child home from school and consider seeking medical attention. Your child could have a serious or contagious illness.

- •. Does your child have a fever above 101 degrees?
- •. Does your child have diarrhea?
- •. Are your child's eyes crusty, bright red, and/or discharging yellow or green fluid and your medical provider recommended he/she stay home conjunctivitis/pink eye?
- •. If your child complains of a stomachache; is it accompanied by fever, vomiting, diarrhea, lethargy, sharp pain, and/or a hard belly?
- •. Does your child have a rash that is undiagnosed and could be contagious?

Keep your child home until he or she has been symptom free for at least 24 hours or until a doctor indicates that he or she can return to school. If your child has a cold, headache, or stomachache that is not accompanied by fever, vomiting or diarrhea, he/she is welcome to come to school. Also, ear aches are not contagious and your child can come to school as long as he/she can concentrate on their work.

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Help Your Child Succeed in School: Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!

DID YOU KNOW?

- · Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- · Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- · Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- · Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- · Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your child to her teachers and classmates before school starts to help her transition.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.

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Ayude a su hijo a tener éxito en la escuela: Creando el hábito de buena asistencia a temprana edad

El éxito escolar va de mano a mano con una buena asistencia escolar!

¿SABÍA QUE...?

- Empezando en el kínder, muchas ausencias pueden causar que los niños se atrasen en la escuela.
- Faltar el 10% (más o menos faltar 18 días en el kinder) puede bajar el rendimiento en el primer grado y hacer que cueste más aprender a leer.
- Los estudiantes se pueden seguir atrasando aunque sólo falten uno o dos días durante varias semanas.
- Las llegadas tarde en los primeros grados pueden predecir que el estudiante tendrá mala asistencia en los años siguientes.
- La falta de asistencia a la escuela puede afectar a todos en la clase, ya que el maestro tiene que disminuir el aprendizaje para ayudar a los niños a ponerse al día.
- Las escuelas pueden perder dinero para programas educacionales porque frecuentemente la asistencia es la base para la asignación de los fondos.

Asistir regularmente a la escuela, ayuda a los niños a sentirse mejor en la escuela—y consigo mismos. Empezar a crear este hábito en la edad preescolar, los hará aprender rápidamente la importancia de ir a la escuela a la hora indicada y todos los días. La buena asistencia ayudará a los niños a tener éxito en la preparatoria, la universidad y en el trabajo.

COMO AYUDAR A SU HIJO

- Establezca una hora consistente para acostarse y la rutina de cada mañana.
- Prepare la ropa y las mochilas la noche anterior.
- Averigüe el día en que empieza la escuela y asegúrese que su hijo tenga las vacunas requeridas.
- Presente a su hijo a sus maestros y compañeros de clase antes que la escuela empiece, para ayudarle con la transición a la escuela.
- Sólo deje que su niño se quede en casa si está realmente enfermo. Tenga en mente que las quejas de un dolor de estómago o de cabeza pueden ser seña de ansiedad y no una razón para quedarse en casa.
- Si su hijo parece ansioso por ir a la escuela, hable con los maestros, consejeros u otros padres para que le aconsejen sobre cómo hacerlo sentir cómodo y motivado a asistir a la escuela.
- Prepare opciones para llegar a la escuela si algo inesperado sucede. Contacte con anterioridad un familiar, un vecino u otro padre para que le ayude en esos días.
- Evite citas médicas y viajes prolongados durante el tiempo de escuela.
- Contacte al personal de la escuela u oficiales de la comunidad para encontrar ayuda sobre transportación, vivienda, empleo o problemas de salud.
