A NOTE FROM YOUR PRINCIPAL


Dear Klatt Families:

Student safety is the single most important aspect of our role in educating students. Throughout the year, our school practices fire, earthquake, stay-puts and violent intruder drills. For our violent intruder drills, we teach students and staff the acronym ALICE—which stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate. For most drills we focus on the first four. Next week, we will be practicing a drill in which teachers determine if evacuating to a rally point is the safest option. This is a new component of our practiced drills and we want to keep you informed in case your child has questions. Our staff always recognizes the emotional toll any drill can have on students. If you have questions, please feel free to give me a call. The book, *I Am Not Scared, I Am Prepared* by Julia Cook is a great resource if you would like to talk to your child about this concern.

Friday, March 8th is a teacher in-service day and there is no school for students on this day. Then, Spring Break begins the following Monday March 11th and students will return to school on Monday, March 18th.

Our 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students will be participating in the Performance Evaluation for Alaska Schools (PEAKS) test this month. The testing window will run from March 25th through April 5th. If you have an appointment, trip, or any other activity planned during this time, please consider rescheduling so your child will not miss any of the testing days.



Estimadas familias de Klatt,

La seguridad de los estudiantes es el aspecto más importante en la educación de los estudiantes. A lo largo del año, nuestra escuela practica simulacros(drills) de incendio, terremoto, y que hacer cuando entran personas intrusas violentas. Para nuestros simulacros de intrusos violentos, enseñamos a los estudiantes y al personal las siglas ALICE, que significa alerta, bloqueo, informar, contrarrestar y evacuar. Para la mayoría de los ejercicios nos centramos en los primeros cuatro. La próxima semana, practicaremos un simulacro en el que los maestros determinarán si evacuar a un punto de reunión es la opción más segura. Este es un componente nuevo de nuestros simulacros practicados y queremos mantenerlo informado en caso de que su hijo tenga preguntas. Glitter Germs in Mrs. Wilhelm's Class



Flu cases in Alaska soared to monthly levels far beyond anything seen in the last four years, according to a report by the state Division of Public Health. Mrs. Wilhelm's class enjoyed a fun educational activity using glitter to learn about germs that might cause you to get sick with the flu. The glitter was like germs that cause diseases. They spread the germs on their hands, and then tapped other children on the hand to see how easily germs spread. The glitter stuck to everything they touched! Well germs are the same, once they get on your hands they can spread to everything you touch. The children then tried to remove the germs by wiping them off with a paper towel—germs were still there. Then they tried washing them off under the water, but when they finished there was still a lot of glitter on their hands. Now our very smart kindergartners and first graders know that soap helps the water to wash the germs away—that's why it's important to use soap every time you wash your hands. Stay healthy!






Reach new PEAKS of learning! Ways to Help Your Child

PEAKS is a computer-based assessment administered to students in Grades 3-9 (English language arts and mathematics) and grades 4, 8 and 10 (science) each spring. This state-required assessment provides students the opportunity to show their understanding of important skills in these content areas at their grade level.


Here are some ways you can help your child prepare for a test:

- Talk to your child about testing. It's helpful for children to understand why schools give tests. For more information about the importance of taking the PEAKS test, visit www.asdk12.org/peaks.
- Encourage your child. Praise him/her for the things they do well. If your child feels confident, he/she will likely do their best on a test. Children who are afraid of failing are more likely to become anxious about test taking.
- Ensure your child attends school regularly. Testing days are important days to be at school on time to allow for the least stressful testing experience for your child. Avoid scheduling appointments on testing days.
- Help your child get a good night's sleep the night before a test.
- Eat a healthy breakfast the morning of a test. Hunger can distract a child from the task at hand. Many ASD schools serve breakfast. Learn more at www.asdk12.org/studentnutrition.
