A NOTE FROM YOUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Klatt families:

I would like to thank everyone for making attendance a priority. As I write this letter, we are half way through the month of September and we've had 96.02% of students at school ready for learning. Keep up the great work! Klatt has a daily goal of 95% attendance or better every day. Thirteen of our classrooms have had 10 days of greater than 95% attendance. Last year, Friday was the second highest day of the week for absences. This year, Fridays have been the lowest number of student absences–97.21% of the student body have been present on Fridays. Last year, October's attendance showed that the day before and the day after Halloween to have a very high rate of absences. If possible, please make these days a priority to have your child at school.

Alaska winter temperatures are on their way. Please make sure your child has all their winter gear. Hats, gloves or mittens, coats, snow pants and boots are necessary for students to stay warm. We ask that you label all your child's gear with their name. If the temperature is above minus ten degrees, students of the Anchorage School District are expected to go outside for recess.

Students will soon be coming to school in the dark. Please help ensure they have something reflective on their outer garments. Walking to school and waiting for the bus can be dangerous if drivers cannot see our students.

Conferences are an important part of what we do, and by working together great things will happen here at Klatt Elementary School. Our parent teacher conferences will be scheduled for Wednesday October 24th and Thursday October 25th this year.

We are looking forward to seeing our Klatt families at the Fall carnival on Saturday, October 27 from 4 to 6 PM. Come for family fun and support our school.

UNA NOTA DEL DIRECTOR

Estimadas Familias de Klatt:

Me gustaría agradecer a todos por hacer de la asistencia a la escuela una prioridad. Mientras escribo esta carta, estamos a la mitad del mes de septiembre y tenemos un 96.02% de alumnos listos para aprender en la escuela. !Continue con ese buen trabajo! Klatt tiene como meta de que los estudiantes asistan a la escuela a un 95% o mejor todos los días. Nueve de nuestros salones de clase han tenido 10 días de asistencia superior al 95%. El año pasado, los viernes eran el segundo día más alto para las ausencias. Este año, los viernes han sido el número más bajo de ausencias estudiantiles: el 97.21% del alumnado estuvo presente los viernes. El año pasado, la asistencia de octubre mostró que el día antes y el día después de Halloween tenía una tasa muy alta de ausencias. Si es posible, haga de estos días una prioridad para tener a su hijo en la escuela.

Las temperaturas invernales de Alaska se aproximan. Por favor, asegúrese de que su hijo tenga todo su equipo de invierno. Gorros, guantes o mitones, chaquetas, pantalones de nieve y botas son necesarios para que los estudiantes se mantengan calientes. Le pedimos que le ponga nombre a toda la ropa de su hijo. Si la temperatura es superior a menos diez grados, se espera que los estudiantes del Distrito Escolar de Anchorage salgan al recreo.

Los estudiantes pronto llegarán a la escuela en la oscuridad. Por favor, ayúdenos a asegurarse de que tengan algo reflejante en sus prendas exteriores. Caminar a la escuela y esperar el autobús puede ser peligroso si los conductores no pueden ver a nuestros estudiantes.

Las conferencias son una parte importante de lo que hacemos, y al trabajar juntas, grandes cosas sucederán aquí en la Escuela Primaria Klatt. Nuestras conferencias de padres y maestros se programarán para el miércoles 24 de octubre y el jueves 25 de octubre de este año.

Estamos deseando ver a nuestras familias Klatt en el carnaval de otoño el sábado 27 de octubre de 4 a 6 pm. Venga a divertirse en familia y apoye a nuestra escuela.

PEAKS 2018 STUDENT LEVEL RESULTS

Dear Parents:

The Performance Evaluation for Alaska's Schools (PEAKS) is Alaska's summative assessment for students in grades 3-9 in English Language art and mathematics and grades 4, 8 and 10 in science and was administered in spring 2018. The purpose of a large-scale, summative assessment is to provide information to parents, educators, policy makers, communities and businesses about how Alaska's schools and districts are performing, along with an overall picture of an individual student's progress in meeting State of Alaska standards at his/her grade level.

At this time, districts and schools are beginning the score reporting process with the preliminary work of interpreting and understanding PEAKS results. The Anchorage School District is currently preparing our online student information system for parents to receive electronic PEAKS results on September 22st.

For both math and English language arts, each student will receive an overall score that is aligned to one of four achievement levels: Proficient, Advanced, Below-Proficient and Far-Below Proficient. Students performing at a scale score of 500 or more are Proficient. In addition, information on groups of standards, called reporting categories, will also be provided as part of the score reporting process. Assessment English Language Arts and Mathematics (and Science grades 4, 8 and 10), available on the Department of Education's website, https://education.alaska.gov/assessments/peaks.

Please remember, PEAKS is not a pass/fail test. PEAKS is aligned to the Alaska State Standards and the scores provide information to guide decision-making and support students on their path to success. Alaska increased the rigor of its standards and assessments so that our students are academically ready for jobs, career training and college. The Anchorage School District maintains high learning expectations for all students and is committed to preparing students for success in life.


- "What are some of the most important things my child should learn this year?"

INFORMATION FOR BUS RIDERS

Student safety is a top priority in the Anchorage School District. We know it's extremely important to

parents as well. With winter weather road conditions right around the corner, it is very important for students to follow the **Riding the Bus** rules.

Please review these with your child:

- Conversations should be at a level 2 voice, which is the level they would use to talk to a friend
- Students must be seated, facing forward and legs should not be in the aisle.
 Students should not get up to switch seats
- There is no eating of food on the bus
- Students should follow the directions from the bus driver
- Stay clear of the road by 10 feet until the bus comes to a complete stop
- •. Always use the handrail to go up and down the steps, one at a time
- •. Cross the road in front of the bus and only when given permission by the bus driver

Thank you for having this discussion with your child.

Also, please expect some delays in the time the bus arrives at the bus stop when there is fresh snow on the ground. Together we can work to make sure children are getting to and from school safely.


