A NOTE FROM YOUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Klatt families:

First of all, I want to thank everyone for all the great support. Klatt currently has 95.48% attendance which is above our school goal of 95%. This past month Klatt was 2.27% higher than last October. This equates to students being at school for approximately 100 more days in just one month compared to last year. The following quote from *attendanceworks.org* explains why your efforts are so important:

"One California study found that only 17 percent of students who were chronically absent in both kindergarten and first grade were reading proficiently in third grade, compared to 64 percent of those with good attendance."

I also want to thank teachers, parents and students for their participation in conferences. This was a great time for everyone to talk about progress in school, student's friends, and how to build on strengths to overcome challenges. Now that conferences are over, please remember to check Parent Connect for updates on student's progress in class. Also, please feel free to reach out to our staff through phone calls and email. As a parent you play the most important role in your child's education. Our school is here to help support you.

Elementary Health Class, your child will study body systems. Talking about each lesson at home will help him/her to remember it.

KINDERGARTEN students will learn about <u>The Five Senses</u>. At your family dinner, why not talk about the senses? Ask your child to describe what the food on their plate tastes like (salty, sweet, etc.). What do the foods smell like? Which foods are hot and which are cold? WHOLE GRAINS-Quinoa, rice, pasta

CEREAL-low sugar, Rolled oats and instant oatmeal

PREPARED MEALS—Low-sodium soups and stews, pop-top meals for kids, kid-friendly healthy snacks

CANNED PROTEINS—Tuna, chicken, pork

NUTS AND BUTTERS

MILKS-Powdered and shelf-stable milk, almond milk, soy milk
