<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Play outside!</u></p> <p>Spend time exploring your yard, neighborhood, parks, or trails. Look around and make observations like a scientist, or notice small details like an artist. Ask questions that inspire you to learn something new or get creative and make art.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Read, Read, Read!</u></p> <p>Read a book to a younger sibling or pet. Make stamina a goal. How many minutes can you read before taking a break?</p> <p><i>Bonus: Record yourself reading, then listen to it.</i></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Math Facts</u></p> <p>Practice your math facts; addition, subtraction, multiplication, or division. Have your parents test you or create problems for your parents to solve (but you should solve it to check your parent's work).</p>

What would you do there?" ● "Describe your dream bedroom. What would be in it?" ● "Describe a day in your life if you were famous." 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Create a Game</u></p> <p>Make up a new game to play with family or friends! Inside or outside, make up the rules and have a great time playing!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Help Someone!</u></p> <p>Find three (3) ways to do something extra to help another person in your family or community. Write a sentence or two to summarize who you helped, what you did, and how you felt about it after you were done.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Math</u></p> <p>K-1 Find 10 groups of 10 and try to make 100.</p> <p>2-3 Practice skip counting by 2's, 5's, 10's and 100's. Challenge: 3's, 4's, 6-9's.</p> <p>4-5 Choose a non-standard measurement and measure 10 things around your home or pick a room and measure the dimensions in feet or meters. Find the area ($L \times W$). Can you figure out the volume ($L \times W \times H$)?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Reading</u></p> <p>K-1 Write a list of items around your house that start with each letter of the alphabet. Try putting them in ABC order.</p> <p>2-3 Listen to a book on tape and draw out what you are visualizing about the story.</p> <p>4-5 Find 3 examples of non-fiction writing in your home.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Writing</u></p> <p>K-1 Practice writing the alphabet in sand, shaving cream, snow, etc., anything you can find. Remember to start your letters at the top.</p> <p>2-3 Write a 3-5 sentence narrative describing your snow day.</p> <p>4-5 Write a review on your book, a Youtube video, or a Tik Tok.</p>
