Dear Baxter Families,

Happy December and thank you for supporting activities at the school such as our recent Turkey Shoot – a wonderful time was had by all and it was a great way for families to get some quality time together. The PTA will be having a Family BINGO Night on the 6th at 6:00 pm and we hope to get as good of a turn-out as we had last month! Choir, orchestra, and band concerts are coming up as well so please check out the calendar of events in this newsletter to plan out your month.

Students will soon take MAP Tests to give our teachers specific academic feedback on where their students are in this moment for their learning. Parents can check into Parent Connect to get more information after the assessments are finished before the break. We use this information to guide our decision making for WIN (What I Need) Groups that happen at every grade level, on every day, to support our little ones in instructional groups with topics as varied as catching up to make academic gains in reading to enrichment art time.

Attached to the newsletter is our School-Wide Discipline Plan; we welcome your feedback as parents and want to let you know that this was cooperatively developed to increase our supports to students in a fair and consistent way, recognizing that students cannot learn if they don't feel safe at school. Our School Counselor, Miss Ula, has been doing check-ins to support students who need additional practice with social skills and solving problems and all teachers are addressing Social Emotional Learning Curriculum through "Respected and Connected." If your child needs any additional supports, please do not hesitate to contact us and let us know what's happening with your family as the holidays can be as stressful as they are wonderful.

This month, as your principals, we have been reflecting upon the concept of "providing opportunities for children." When most people hear this, perhaps they think of after-school programs for creative writing, private dance lessons or travel. However, what we are referring to are opportunities for our kids to grow as people from the experiences they have in life – both positive and negative.

Making a mistake or inappropriate choice is important to us as humans (especially as kids) because it allows us to grow into self-directed and self-regulated adults. When we understand why our choices were not helpful to ourselves or the community, when we're able to feel safe and vulnerable enough to admit the true facts of the scenario, and when we are surrounded by caring adults (at school and at home) who hold us responsible to a higher standard of choices, we have the capacity to change. When any of those elements are missing, our growth is stifled and we continue to make the same mistakes again and again and again.

It's hard as a parent, especially in the moment, to recognize that making a mistake is a way for our child to grow. We take away the opportunity for growth when we justify our child's behavior (i.e.: "the other kid deserved it") as it becomes an acceptable choice in our child's mind and then the same issue happens again (and again.) For example, this is a common situation that comes to the office: "She called me a name so I pushed her. I know I shouldn't have hit someone but I was mad and she started it." This student has the ability to tell the truth about the situation and realizes why this is not appropriate (2/3 of the elements are there for success and growth.) The next step is critical and relates to how the adults around her respond to the situation.


At school, we provide re-teaching opportunities, supports and consequences delivered in a caring way to help students understand social boundaries. In this scenario, we would acknowledge that name calling hurts, show empathy for the child's perspective and teach the student other ways to respond to a difficult situation (minus physical violence.) When parents arrive to discuss the issue, students are most likely to change their behavior when the message between home and school is the same – we know it hurts when name calling happens but let's look at other ways to solve a problem before we resort to violence. With that in mind, I want to thank families for their support when mistakes are made at school as another kind of learning is taking place that's just as important as academics.

Social Media Problems have also been a concern with our older students so please learn as much as you can about each of the "Apps" your child is on. We will look into having an Internet Safety Night in the Spring, for families, hosted by the Anchorage Police Department to empower parents to understand what is out there online that our kids are engaging with.

Thanks for sending your children to school at Baxter Elementary and we look forward to serving you in the new year... 2020! Where does the time go?










Turkey Shoot 2019
