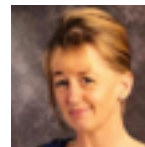

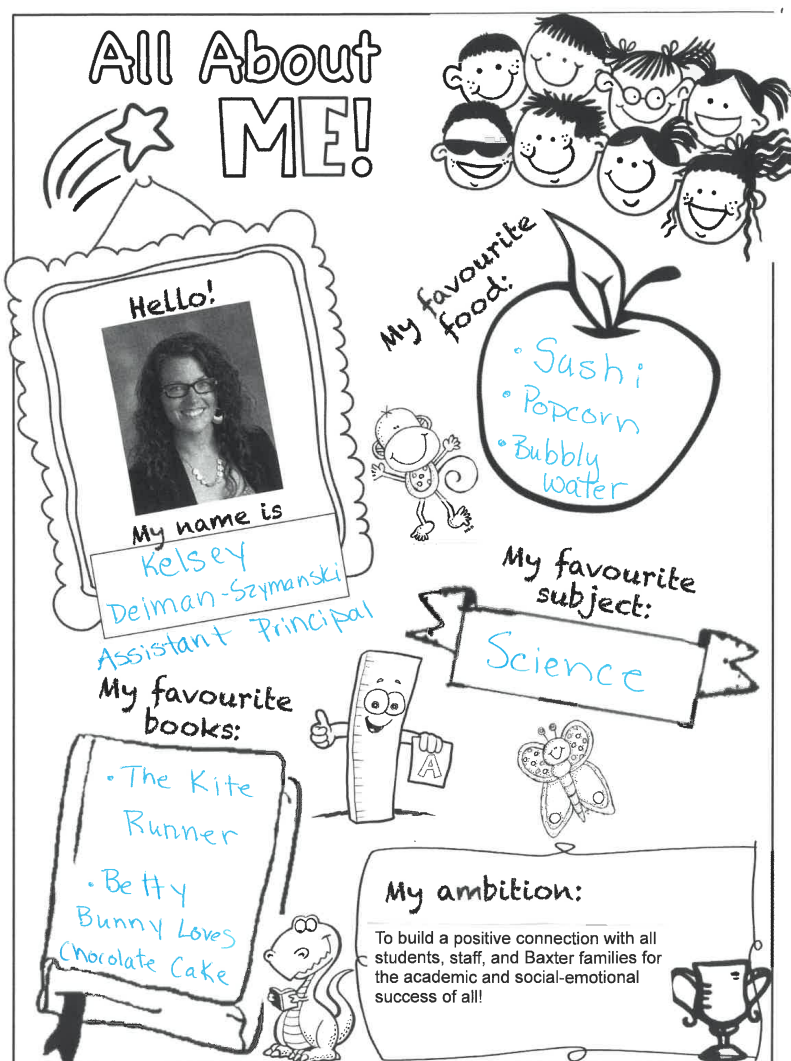

Questions of the Heart

A Valentine heart is a **symbol**, or a simple drawing used by people to represent something else. It is more difficult to draw a heart that looks **realistic**, looking like the real heart that pumps blood through the body. Is that why we don't draw realistic hearts for Valentine's Day? Gross.

Besides representing a human heart, a Valentine heart is also a symbol of love and kindness. Science, however, shows that emotions are chemical reactions in the brain, not in the heart. Love comes from oxytocin flooding the cortex of the brain.

Yet we don't draw Valentine brains. Why?

Who decided hearts were what held our love and kindness?

Art history may help answer that. Way back in 2500 B.C., artists in Egypt made a large painting on a wall, called a **mural**, that illustrated the importance of being light hearted—



literally. Long ago, Egyptians believed that after someone died, the gods weighed the person's heart against the Feather of **Maat**, the goddess of justice. A heavy, cruel heart was bad news. If instead the heart was lighter than the feather, the person could experience paradise.

Perhaps the connection we make to hearts goes way back to Ancient Egypt. Even today, actions of love and kindness seem to lighten hearts.

3. School dress code applies to ALL costumes. Please have costumes ready for auditions so there is time to make any adjustments if needed.
4. Acts are limited to 3 minutes MAXIMUM.
5. You may only perform in one act.
6. There are no makeup auditions for students who do not follow the talent show rules or forget to audition. Only students with excused absences will be allowed a later audition date.
7. If you're performing as a group, each member needs to turn in a slip and each slip needs everyone in the group listed.

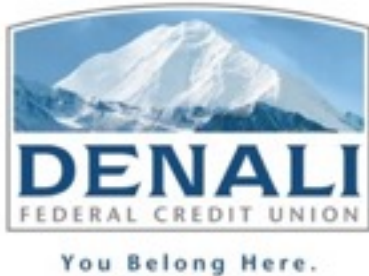
