#### **Principal's Corner**



We are off to a fast and productive start! The school year will progress as fast as summer break has. Remember that the days are long but the years are short! Your children will be grown and gone before you know it, so it is important to cherish this time when they are young and plan for their success. Students who attend school 95% of the time or better will progress at a full year's progress or beyond. Students who attend less than 95% of the time are more likely to fall behind. Unless a student is ill, they should be at school every day. The below rates identify the days absent to percent ratios:

- Excellent = 0-3 absences (98-100%)
- Good = 4-9 absences (95-98%)
- Average = 10-14 absences (92-95%)
- Poor = 15-19 absences (89-92%)
- Severe = more than 20 absences (>89%)

#### **Power of Positive Students (POPS)**

Birchwood ABC Elementary is a positive learning environment. This is accomplished through the dedication of our staff, parents, and the community who ensure that our students receive the highest degree of education in a safe and inviting atmosphere. Recognition of positive student behavior is a necessary component in maintaining a successful learning environment. Birchwood ABC has begun to implement the POPS program. When a staff member or visitor in the building observes a student or students contributing in a positive way. they will provide them a POPS slip. The student will then bring the slip to the office and share it with the principal. They will leave a copy in the office and take a copy home to share with parents. At the end of each week, one slip per grade level will be drawn and that student will be further recognized during morning announcements and will earn a reward. The more POPS slips that a student earns during a week the more they improve their chances of earning the reward.

# ALICE Evacuation Drill Wednesday, September 4th

We will practice our 1<sup>st</sup> ALICE Violent Intruder Drill on Wednesday September 4<sup>th</sup>. This drill will include the evacuation to a rally point. Our rally point is the soccer field near Chugiak High School. We will evacuate the school after the drill is announced over the intercom. Students and staff will stage in the areas that are designated for them during a fire drill. All students and staff will be accounted for and we will then walk to the rally point. We will again account for all staff and students at the rally point. We will then return to school, where all teachers will take role when they return to their classrooms. # **APD Information: Illegal Use of Handheld Devices in School Zones**

As of June 20, 2019, handheld cell phone use is illegal in active school zones and/or upon school grounds. If caught violating this new ordinance, the fine is a big one: 6 points on driver's license and a \$500 fine. Here are the pertinent points to know regarding AMC 9.28.055(E)(1):

- This law is in effect 6am 9pm seven days a week, 365 days a year.
- This law applies to all signed school zones where the speed limit is 25 mph.
- This law applies to all school zones where there are temporary speed reductions to 20 mph or less (the school zones with the yellow flashing lights).
- This law does NOT apply to vehicles that are stopped (ex: parked in a school parking lot) or if the mobile device is being used hands-free.
- If a person in violation of this ordinance also causes a collision that results in injury or death, the penalty for this ordinance becomes a misdemeanor.

# MAP and FastBridge Assessment: Window – 9/3-9/20.

The FastBridge assessment, will be replacing AIMSweb this year. All students in Kindergarten,  $1^{st}$  and  $2^{nd}$  grade will be tested in reading with a 1-on-1 proctor on September 5th. First grade students will also have a computer-based assessment in math. Second graders will also have a computer-based assessment for both math and reading.

MAP assessments are administered to 3rd-6th grade students. Please see the following schedule:

- 3<sup>rd</sup>- Reading, 9/5 and Math, 9/6
- 4<sup>th</sup> Reading, 9/9 and Math, 9/10
- $5^{\text{th}}$  and  $6^{\text{th}}$  Reading, 9/12 and Math, 9/13
- Make-ups will be scheduled as needed

# PEAKS 2019 Student-Level Results

The Performance Evaluation for Alaska's Schools (PEAKS) is Alaska's summative assessment for students in grades 3-9 in English Language art and mathematics and grades 4, 8 and 10 in science and was administered in spring 2019. The purpose of a large-scale, summative assessment is to provide information to parents, educators, policy makers, communities and businesses about how Alaska's schools and districts are performing, along with an overall picture of an individual student's progress in meeting State of Alaska standards at his/her grade level.

At this time, districts and schools are beginning the score reporting process with the preliminary work of interpreting and understanding PEAKS results. The Anchorage School District is currently preparing our online student information system for parents to receive electronic PEAKS results on September 20<sup>th</sup>.

For both math and English language arts, each student will receive an overall score that is aligned to one of four achievement levels: Proficient, Advanced, Below-Proficient and Far-Below Proficient. Students performing at a scale score of 500 or more are Proficient. In addition, information on groups of standards, called reporting categories, will also be provided as part of the score reporting process.

This year, English language arts (ELA) for grades 4-9 will include a Text-Dependent Analysis, or TDA score. The TDA is an item based on a passage or set of passages that a student reads during the ELA assessment. The TDA addresses both literary and informational texts. Students must draw on basic writing skills while inferring and synthesizing information from the passage in order to develop a comprehensive, holistic essay response.

The Text-Dependent Analysis is reported at the student level in grades 4-9 as one of the English language arts Reporting Categories. The TDA is hand-scored by the testing vendor using a rubric with a score range of 0-4, with a score of four being the highest. The rubric will be available in the *ASD PEAKS Parent Guide*.

Please remember, PEAKS is not a pass/fail test. PEAKS is aligned to the Alaska State Standards and the scores provide information to guide decision-making and support students on their path to success. Alaska increased the rigor of its standards and assessments so that our students are academically ready to succeed in the community, jobs, career training, the military and college. The Anchorage School District maintains high learning expectations for all students and is committed to preparing students for success in life.
