2021 School Climate and Connectedness Survey ©

Birchwood Families,

Birchwood ABC ES is partnering with the Association of Alaska School Boards to conduct the School Climate and Connectedness Survey ©, a statewide survey taken by students, staff, and families. This survey measures their perceptions of each school's climate including the engagement of students, staff, and families.

The Student Survey will be given to students in grades 3-6. The survey window for our school is March 1 – March 26. Students will complete the survey online during the school day.

The student survey will ask questions such as how students feel about school rules, their perceptions of how students treat each other, their relationships with staff, social and emotional skills, and observed risk behaviors of other students at school and school events. There are different surveys for younger students (grades 3-5) and older students (grades 6-12).

Family Survey: We also value input from our families. You are an important partner as we work to continually improve each school's environment. Each parent/guardian is asked to complete one survey prior to March 26. If you have more than one child attending this school, you only need to fill out one survey. All of these surveys are voluntary, anonymous, confidential, and do not ask questions about students' families. If you do not wish for your child to participate, please notify the school in writing.

2021 PEAKS State Assessment2021 PEAKS Testing WindowMarch 29-April 30

Each spring, Alaskan students are provided an opportunity to show what they know. When students show what they know, teachers and parents can partner to promote student success.

The Performance Evaluation for Alaska's Schools (PEAKS) is Alaska's summative assessment administered to students in Grades 3-9 (English language arts and mathematics) and grades 5, 8 and 10 (science) each spring. The purpose of a large-scale, summative assessment is to provide parents

and schools an overall picture of a student's progress in meeting the Alaska standards at his/her grade level. The assessment is taken on the computer and is not timed, but each content area takes approximately 100-180 minutes.

Parents can locate resources for the PEAKS assessment, including directions for PEAKS Practice tests, called Online Tools Training and PEAKS Tutorials on the ASD website at www.asdk12.org/PEAKS.

Parents can also help by ensuring their children are well rested, eat a nutritious breakfast, and are at school on time for the days of testing. Please avoid scheduling appointments on your child's testing days.

The ASD PEAKS testing window allows for school assessment scheduling flexibility. Birchwood ABC's grade level specific testing schedule will be available after spring break.

Save the Date: Picture day is Tuesday May 18^{th.} Pictures will be taken outside and mailed to parents.

Travel Policy for all ASD Staff & Students

This policy applies to **all** ASD staff and students **regardless of age** who return from travel outside of Alaska.

Travelers are **required** to submit a negative SARS-CoV2 test result from a test taken no earlier than 72 hours of arrival into Alaska.

- Test must be molecular-based (PCR). No antigen or antibody test.
- Test can be taken upon arrival in Alaska or anytime thereafter.
- Test can be taken no earlier than 72 hours prior to arrival in Alaska.
- The traveler must maintain strict social distance from work/school until test results are available.
 - If the result is positive, the traveler must remain in self-isolation and must not return to work/school until cleared by a Municipality or State Healthcare Provider (i.e. Public Health Nurse, Contact Tracer, Pediatrician, or Family Physician, etc.).
 - If the result is negative, the traveler may return to work/school as long as they are asymptomatic.
- Submit the negative result to your school nurse (student) or supervisor (employee).

If traveler chooses not to get a SARS-CoV2 test:

- The traveler **must maintain strict social distance** for 10 days from arrival in Alaska.
- The traveler may return to work/school on Day 11, if asymptomatic.

Travel outside of Alaska for less than 72 hours:

- No test requirement if currently asymptomatic.
- Must follow <u>isolation protocols</u> if experiencing symptoms.

Prior confirmed positive SARS-CoV2 result within 90 days of departure: (All Travelers)

- The traveler does not need a SARS-CoV2 test or to maintain social distance if the three following conditions are met:
 - 1. The traveler provides proof of a previously positive result of a molecular based test for SARS-CoV2 within 90 days of travel;
 - 2. The traveler is currently asymptomatic;
 - 3. The traveler submits the positive result with the date to your school nurse (student) or supervisor (employee).

Fully-Vaccinated individuals:

- Fully-vaccinated travelers will need to follow the above travel testing protocols.
 - Fully-vaccinated is defined as two weeks after receiving the second dose in a twodose series, or two weeks after receiving a single-dose vaccine.

At Home Health Screening for Parents and Guardians

Ask these questions at home before sending students to school. Anyone who answers "yes" to one or more of these questions must not enter the school or participate in a school sport or activity.

- Within the last 10 days, have you been diagnosed with COVID-19 or had a positive test for the virus?
- Have you had any of these symptoms in the last 24 hours?
 - Fever (defined as a temperature 100.4F or higher)
 - · Chills
 - New trouble breathing or shortness of breath
 - · New cough
 - Diarrhea
 - · Abdominal pain
 - Vomiting

- Fatigue
- Joint pain
- Muscle aches or body aches
- · New rash
- Loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Headache
- · New congestion
- New runny nose

Do you live in the same household or have you had close contact in the last 14 days with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19? Close contact counts if you have been within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes (cumulative over 24 hrs), or if someone from public health contacted you to let you know

you are a contact.

Note: If a child or staff member lives with someone else who was named as a contact, it is okay for the child or staff member to go to school. We do not quarantine contacts of contacts.

STAY HOME or go home immediately if the answer is YES to one or more questions above. The next step is to call a doctor and consider getting tested for COVID-19. Do not go to the doctor's office without calling first. Seek emergency care immediately for difficulty breathing, chest pain, confusion, sleepiness, or other severe problems.

Parents / guardians should follow the Return to School Options pathway (see reverse) to determine when to send students back to school. DO NOT send student to school with any of the above symptoms.

Mask Guidance for School-Aged Children

The CDC recommends the use of non-medical grade cloth face coverings in public settings where other physical distancing measures are difficult to maintain. When used with other risk mitigating efforts, non-medical grade masks can further reduce the transmission of SARS-CoV-2 in public areas and a school building.

Masks are considered safe for most children and youth over the age of two years. There are very few exceptions for wearing masks.

Should a child be required to wear a mask during school?*

The child has asthma.



YFS

The American Academy of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology recommends that individuals with asthma wear a mask in public.

The child has a condition such as autism spectrum disorder, intellectual disability, or a mental health disorder.



YES

These conditions do not necessarily justify a mask exemption unless the child is unable to wear a mask without excessive trauma or frequent manipulation.

The child cannot communicate clearly while wearing a mask.



YES

Explore instructional adaptations or use a face mask with a clear plastic insert as appropriate.

The child cannot remove the mask on their own.



NO

Encourage the family to consider virtual learning opportunities.

The child is asleep or unconscious.


