Principal's Corner



We are off to a fast and productive start! The school year will progress as fast as summer break. Remember that the days are long, but the years are short! Your children will be grown and gone before you know it, so it is important to cherish this time when they are young and plan for their success. Students who attend school 95% of the time or better will achieve a full year of progress or beyond. Students who attend less than 95% of the time are more likely to fall behind. Students should be at school every day. ASD recognizes the following reasons as excused absences:

- 1. Illness
- 2. Death or serious illness in the immediate family
- 3. Participation in school activities
- 4. Religious obligations
- 5. Extenuating circumstance

The rates below identify the days absent to percent ratios:

• Excellent = 0-3 absences (98-100%)

- Good = 4-9 absences (95-98%)
- Average = 10-14 absences (92-95%)
- Poor = 15-19 absences (89-92%)
- Severe = more than 20 absences (>89%)

Power of Positive Students (POPS)

Birchwood ABC Elementary is a positive learning environment. This is accomplished through the dedication of our staff, parents and the community who ensure that our students receive the highest degree of education in a safe and inviting atmosphere. Recognition of positive student behavior is a necessary component in maintaining a successful learning environment. Birchwood ABC implements the POPS program. When a staff member or visitor in the building observes a student or students contributing in a positive way then they will provide them with a POPS slip. The student will then bring the slip to the office and share it with the principal. They will leave a copy in the office and take a copy home to share with their parents. At the end of each week one slip per grade level will be drawn and that student will be further recognized during morning announcements and will earn a reward. The more POPS slips that a student earns during a week the more they improve their chances of receiving a reward.

Gas Cards

ASD has provided Birchwood ABC with some gas cards to provide families with assistance during the bussing situation. Unfortunately, we only have enough to help families who are in significant need of this support. Please inquire at the office if you need this assistance.

2022-2023 Covid Changes in ASD

What has Changed:

ASD does not plan to offer any form of COVID testing in the schools for 22/23 school year and testing is not a requirement. If you are ill and choose to test for COVID and are positive you will need to follow current CDC guidelines for isolation. You can find those guidelines on the CDC website and summarized below:

- If you have a positive test, isolate for 5 days.
- You may return to school with symptoms resolving on day 6. You will need to wear a mask day 6-10.

Families with students at **pricing schools** are encouraged to apply. Please include <u>all ASD</u> <u>students</u> in your household in the student section on the meal application, regardless of where they attend school, so we may certify your family in one application together. You may apply at any time of the year if your circumstances change due to layoffs, adding people to your households or decreased income.

If all of your ASD students attend Community Eligible Program (CEP) schools, no



application is required. If some students attend pricing schools and some attend community eligble schools, you should apply. Note: Applications for the 22-23 school year will be accepted between mid July and the beginning of August 2022. Again if all of your students attended CEP schools this year, please do NOT apply.

I, _____, certify that I am the parent or legal guardian of minor child ______ (the "Participant"). I request that the Participant be given the opportunity to participate in the Elementary Cross Country Running Jamboree (Jamboree) on ______, 20____. Permission is

hereby given for the Participant to participate. In consideration of the benefits and opportunities afforded the Participant by participating, I, on behalf of myself and the Participant, state and unconditionally agree as follows: 1. References to the Anchorage School District (the "District") include the District, its past, present, and/or future

1. References to the Anchorage School District (the "District") include the District, its past, present, and/or future board members, administrators, officers, employees, volunteers, parents, students, agents, attorneys, insurers, reinsurers, representatives, designees, and assigns.

2. I understand that participation in the Jamboree involves certain risks and dangers inherent with running programs on trails, pathways & through wooded areas. These inherent risks include (without limitation) changing weather conditions; existing and changing snow/ice/mud conditions; uneven ground and/or trail surfaces; potential exposure to wild life including moose and bear, insect bites; bare spots; rocks; exposed roots, stumps and trees; collisions with these natural objects and with man-made objects, or other runner or pedestrians on the trails; variations in terrain; the negligence of the Participant; and the negligence of others, including drivers of vehicles near the trails and in cross walks. These inherent risks may result in fatigue; injury; significant injury/disability; and even death. I have made my own investigation of the risks of participation in the Jamboree as the parent or legal guardian of the Participant and on behalf of the Participant, and I understand these risks and assume them willingly on behalf of myself, the Participant, and each and every one of our heirs, representatives, executors, administrators, and assigns.

3. ON BEHALF OF MYSELF, THE PARTICIPANT, AND EACH AND EVERY ONE OF OUR HEIRS, REPRESENTATIVES, EXECUTORS, ADMINISTRATORS, AND ASSIGNS, I UNEQUIVOCALLY ASSUME ALL RISKS RELATED TO PARTICIPATING IN THE JAMBOREE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE RISKS IDENTIFIED IN SECTION 2, ABOVE, THAT MAY ARISE OUT OF OR PERTAIN TO THE PARTICIPANT'S PARTICIPATION IN THE JAMBOREE.

4. Throughout the duration, I hereby grant permission to the District and any chaperones to authorize and consent to any emergency medical treatment, procedure, or provision of medication or medical assistance of any kind for the Participant, and I agree that such action shall be subject to the terms of this Agreement. I hereby authorize any provider of medical services to rely on this consent.

5. ON BEHALF OF MYSELF, THE PARTICIPANT, AND EACH AND EVERY ONE OF OUR HEIRS, REPRESENTATIVES, EXECUTORS, ADMINISTRATORS, AND ASSIGNS, TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, AGREE TO FOREVER RELEASE, INDEMNIFY, AND HOLD THE DISTRICT HARMLESS FROM ANY CLAIMS OR CAUSES OF ACTION (WHETHER SOUNDING IN TORT [NEGLIGENCE, NEGLIGENT HIRING/TRAINING/SUPERVISION, WRONGFUL DEATH, OR OTHERWISE], CONTRACT, WARRANTY, STATUTORY LIABILITY, STRICT LIABILITY, OR OTHERWISE), DEMANDS, OR EXPENSES (INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COSTS) OF ANY KIND OR NATURE WHATSOEVER THAT IN ANY WAY ARISE OUT OF, RESULT FROM, OR PERTAIN TO THE PARTICIPANT'S PARTICIPATION IN THE JAMBOREE.

6. Should the District, or anyone acting on its behalf, incur attorney's fees and/or costs to enforce the terms of this Agreement, or to defend any claims brought by myself and/or the Participant, I hereby agree to indemnify and hold the District harmless for (in other words, I agree to pay for) any and all such attorney's fees and/or costs.

Considerations Before Applying

ASD strives to provide opportunities for preschool students with disabilities to interact and learn with typically-developing peers. The Buddy Bear model is not intended to provide early childhood education for typically-developing children; it is designed to support the development of young children who are identified as developmentally-delayed or disabled.

A maximum of three Buddy Bears are allocated per classroom. Allocations will be determined by the principal and school team and will be reviewed throughout the school year. The number of Buddy Bear students allocated to each preschool special education class is based on the enrollment and needs of the special education students in each class. Program Information

- Children 4-years-old on or before September 1, 2022 attend 11:30am-3:30pm, Monday-Friday
- Children younger than 4-years-old on or before September 1, 2022 attend either 8:15-10:45am or 12:15pm-2:45pm, Monday-Thursday
- Communication programs (Creekside, Taku, Ravenwood) operate 8:15-10:45am or 12:15pm-2:45pm, Monday/Tuesday or Wednesday/Thursday
- · Age Eligibility: Children must be at least 3 years old to apply

Transportation is not provided for the Buddy Bear Program.

Application and Selection

In consultation with the school team(s), principals select Buddy Bears based on program and classroom needs, and returning Buddy Bear status. Buddy Bear applicants must complete the *Buddy Bear Application*. The *Ages & Stages (ASQ) Screener* is completed by the family when contacted by a school for possible selection.

Families will be contacted by the school if/when a program determines space is available for a Buddy Bear. Families may be contacted for a potential spot in the Buddy Bear program throughout the school year.

Buddy Bears must reapply each school year.
