Team Mt. Olympus!


Your child's Team teachers have already spent a year working together, and we are all ready to serve you and your child. Here is a little introduction to your Team Teachers:

Mrs. Duprow- ELA/ELA Advanced and Social Studies Gr. 8


This is my second year at Hanshew and 10th year in the Anchorage School District. I also spent 8 years at Rabbit Creek Elementary. Welcome to Hanshew!

Ms. Franklin - Language Arts.






Team Machu Picchu!



Nurse Nuggets

Hi! I am the school nurse at Hanshew! The hours I am available at Hanshew are 8-3 Mon-Friday. I can be reached directly at 907-742-9913 or the general Hanshew number. Call anytime for questions, concerns, or just to chat about your daughter or son, including any medical issues or changes.

When school starts in person, I will need updated plans for asthma, allergies, seizure, diabetes, or any other conditions I need to be aware of. These can be obtained from and completed by your physician, and signed by you, and faxed into Hanshew at 349-2835 or scanned and sent to my email (seybert_kathy@asdk12.org). I will also need orders from your child's physician for medication to be given at school. Over the counter meds such as acetaminophen (Tylenol), ibuprofen (Motrin) must also have signed med form which can be found on the ASD website. I will be contacting you if any immunizations are due. Religious exemptions need to be filled out and submitted annually.

I will be doing a Flu clinic. This has not been scheduled yet, time and place will be determined and shared. It is strongly encouraged to get the flu vaccine to protect you and your family from influenza and having more stress on the health care systems.

The information on COVID changes daily, but what is most important is hand washing for at least 20 seconds, maintaining a distance of at least 6 feet away from others, and wearing mask in public. Being closer than 6 week is cumulative, meaning, if you are less than 6 feet away for 5 min 3 times a day, that's too much! Symptoms include: fever, chills (100.4), cough, shortness of breath, tiredness or fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea. Anyone exhibiting these symptoms, should get evaluated by a healthcare provider or go for free testing.

Free testing sites without referral needed include: Anchorage Church of Christ, Changepoint Church, Fairview Community Rec Center, Loussac Library, and Muldoon Community Assembly. Testing schedule is Monday 8am-6p, Friday 12pm-8pm and Saturday 8am-6pm.

Eneput What is Eneput?

Eneput is Title VI, Indian Education program at Hanshew. The Title VI, Indian Education program supports schools to provide Alaska Native & Native American students opportunities to meet and exceed academic and cultural standards. We are available to assist families with navigating school. Each program at the Middle and High Schools with Indian Ed staff has its unique name.

At Hanshew, we are Eneput, which is Yup'ik for "Our House." Eneput was gifted to us by fluent Yup'ik speaker and former longtime Hanshew Staff member, Pauline Haas. At Hanshew, we have two Eneput staff members. Marti Pausback is our Youth Development Tutor, and Abel Peca-Medlin is the Community Counselor. At Hanshew, our demographics are close to over one in four students being Alaska Native/ Native American. We provide support for the Eneput students at Hanshew with academics, attendance, providing outreach, and cultural enrichment opportunities.

I have an open-door policy for students to discuss their schedules, grades, or personal issues. Families know their students best, so please contact me if you would like someone to check in with your student at school. We can work together to develop a strategy that'll help your student, or I can meet individually with your student. I reach out to all of our students, and as I get to know the students, I'll meet with them as needed. Sometimes another Teacher, administrator, or another Hanshew staff member will notify me to check in with a student.

Migrant families can come to Hanshew on **September 28th from 10am-Noon** to pick-up a book to keep; look for our outside table.


Sports & Activities
