Additional Programs

- All 9th grade in Pre-AP English and History (unless in The Seminar School): Pre-AP is for all students, giving them the opportunity to learn the foundational knowledge and skills they need to be successful in general 11th and 12th grade classes, Career Tech classes, and AP and other college-level coursework
- Career/Technical Pathway: Computer Science program, Math/Technology Collaborative Career Pathway, Culinary Arts and Prostart Pathway.

AP Capstone (one of only two schools to have this): AP Capstone is a 2-year high school pilot program developed by the College Board, which consists of two new courses: the AP Seminar and AP Research. Students who successfully complete the program and obtain scores of 3 or higher on at least four other AP exams receive either an AP Capstone Diploma or an AP Seminar and Research Certificate.
