The ASD Virtual 6-12 program utilizes

- [Apex Learning](#) - Apex Learning Courses are built to standards to meet middle school requirements and strict high school graduation criteria with a rigorous curriculum. Engaging content keeps students interested and motivated to succeed. At the same time, Courses are designed to help students learn independently.
- [eDynamics Learning](#) - eDynamic Learning offers students sequenced learning tracks aligned to national standards of both middle school and high school, bringing students to the doorstep of industry-endorsed CTE pathways, and career preparedness.
- [Suite 360](#) - Suite360 offers short weekly lessons to help students develop skills to:
 - Understand and manage emotions
 - Set and reach positive goals

ASD teachers will work with you to monitor your student’s progress, pacing, and content mastery while providing professional insight, instruction, and support.

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Student Log-in Information and Course Offerings

- Students access their learning platforms via [Clever](#)

- Student user names are formatted as such: "lastname.firstname"
 - Student passwords are their existing or default ASD password
- Full-time virtual students will have courses in Apex and eDynamic through Canvas.
- Part-time students, it depends on the course(s) they are taking.
 - Core classes and certain electives: Apex
 - ALVS Courses are within Apex
 - Electives: eDynamic through Canvas

When will my Schedule be Available?

- Students will see scheduled courses through [StudentConnect](#) and will have access to courses on Tuesday, August 17th.
- ASDV course requests are submitted by counselors. Courses requests submissions starting Monday, August 16th could create a two/three day delay in accessing the course.
- ASDV is currently scheduling additional teachers to cover several AP and select World Language courses.

ASD Virtual Student Contract

As ASD Virtual continues to grow and students access materials from multiple sources it is important to refresh students on the policy for taking an online course and academic integrity.

All students and parents/guardians must sign the following contract:

Alternate Proctoring

- For high school students, end of unit tests must be taken with a proctor via a Zoom session. Your teacher will post their Zoom office schedule when you can take tests or request help with class content.
- For middle school students, you will need to coordinate with your teacher when to have the test unlocked.

Before joining a proctoring session, students will:

- Ensure all unit activities have been completed and scored
- Put away all devices that will not be used to take the test or connect to the Zoom session
- Put away all class material, unless the teacher has given permission to use notes and/or study guides
- After joining the proctoring session, in the Q&A section the student should enter the following information:
 - Students full name
 - Students course
 - Course teacher's name
 - Unit test number

Important: If you join the Zoom proctoring session in the last 30 minutes of the session, you may not have time to complete the test. New tests will not be opened for proctoring if less than 30 minutes remain in the session.
