

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### Taku Library News:



#### <u>Curricula</u>

For October, the genre, or style of writing, of the month is Mystery. A mystery is a made-up story in which a detective finds the answer to a question or solves a crime, using clues. Mysteries usually contain an atmosphere of excitement and suspense and are great for developing critical thinking skills because the reader puts together clues to solve the mystery along with the book character(s).

This month in the library, students at specific grade levels are being supported in meeting the **Common Core Standards for English Language Arts** in the following areas.

*Kindergarten* – We will emphasize book handling and care, book selection, library locations, and fiction versus nonfiction. In these activities, we will focus on standards RL.K.3 (identify characters, setting, and events), RL.K.4 and RI.K.4 (ask / answer questions about unknown words in fiction and nonfiction), RI.K.5 (identify front and back covers and title page), SL.K.1.a and SL.K.1.b (collaborative conversations), and L.K.1.d (grammar conventions and question words).

*First Grade* – We will look at book handling and care; book selection and discussion; author, illustrator, and title; library locations; and parts

of a book. Through these activities, we will address standards RI.1.1 and RI.1.2 (ask / answer questions about key details and identify main topic) and standards SL.1.1.a, SL.1.1.b, and SL.1.1.c (collaborative conversations).

Second Grade – We will conduct book discussions; share good ideas for book handling, care, and selection; review author, illustrator, title, publisher, and copyright; look at elements of a story (characters, plot, setting, etc.); explore library locations; examine parts of a book (emphasizing title page); and compare fiction versus nonfiction. Through these activities, we will focus on standards RL.2.1 and SL.2.3 (ask / answer questions to demonstrate understanding and clarify comprehension) and standards SL.2.1.b and SL.2.1.c (collaborative conversations).

*Third Grade* – Through book discussion; demonstration of effective book handling, care, and selection; review of author, illustrator, title, publisher, and copyright; defining elements of a story; exploring library locations; and examining the parts of a book (emphasizing title page, table of contents, index, and glossary), we will target standards RI.3.1 (ask / answer questions to demonstrate understanding) and RI.3.5 (use text features and search tools to locate information).

*Fourth Grade* – By participating in readers' theater, exploring library locations, and conducting library research, we will address standards RI.4.1 (use details and examples) and SL.4.6 (differentiate between situations requiring formal and informal English).

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*Fifth Grade* – By participating in readers' theater, engaging in book discussion, and talking about the research process (brainstorming topics, using a variety of sources, and synthesis), we will focus on standards RI.5.1 (quote accurately from text when explaining explicit answers and inferences), RI.5.2 (determine main ideas), and SL.5.6 (adapt speech to various contexts).

Sixth Grade – By participating in readers' theater, engaging in book discussion, participating in the research process (brainstorming topics, using a variety of sources, and synthesis), and investigating the topics of intellectual property and digital literacy, we will address a number of standards. We will compare / contrast the experience of listening versus reading (RL.6.7). We will determine an author's point of view or purpose (RI.6.6). We will conduct mini-research projects (W.6.7). We will engage in collaborative discussions (SL.6.1.a and SL.6.1.d). Finally, we will continue a series of Internet Safety / Responsibility lessons begun in previous years.

#### Library Class of the Month

All students will continue to compete to win the Library Class of the Month award. Winning classes will be announced during Quarterly Assemblies. Please plan to attend Quarterly Assemblies where you can celebrate all our students' achievements!

### Recess Read-Aloud / Young Readers' Choice

If the library schedule permits, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students will be invited to attend

Recess Read-Aloud sessions, in conjunction with the Young Readers' Choice program. These programs encourage recreational reading, book discussion, and student voting on which book they consider the best written during the year. These programs are a great way to encourage students to read and think critically. Please look for a permission slip for these programs soon.

#### Maker Space

If the library schedule permits, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will be invited to visit the library once a week during recess to create, explore, collaborate, and learn using a variety of materials ranging from lego blocks to cardboard tubes, straws, paper plates, tissue paper, and the like. No permission slip is required.










#### Notice to Parents:

- Quadrivalent (designed to protect against two influenza A and two influenza B viruses).
- No latex or thimerosal.
- The "high dose" flu vaccine (for people 65 and older) will not be available at this event.
- The flu vaccine has been modified by WHO (World Health Organization) for the 2018-2019 season.
- It takes approximately 2 weeks to build up immunity after getting a flu shot.
- You cannot get the flu from the vaccine.
