Practice SAT/ACT




- Frontier Tutoring will offer FREE practice SAT and ACT tests virtually.
 - <u>Practice ACT</u> 10/22 and 2/18
 - <u>Practice SAT</u> 10/23 and 2/19
- 10th and 11th graders are encouraged to do a practice SAT and/or ACT
- To sign up for the practice ACT/SAT with Frontier, please go to the Curriculum Office.











-SAT/ACT-

- Juniors are encouraged to take the SAT and/or ACT in the spring of 11th grade. This allows students time to re-take the test(s) again in the fall of senior year if they wish to try to improve their score.
 - Please NOTE due to COVID19, we recommend you check your testing sites regularly for cancellations. Cancellations are not under the jurisdiction of ASD
 - Be sure to enter ERHS's code (020368) when you sign up for the SAT/ACT. This allows your scores to be sent to the school district. (Required for APS)
 - SAT/ACT fee waivers are available to students who qualify for free/reduced lunch. Please contact your counselor for more information.








ASVAB
