### **Message from the Superintendent**

Dear ASD families and community,

Based on the increasing community spread of the virus and the rising demand placed on the Anchorage medical community, I am announcing this evening that the Anchorage School District will not resume in-person learning for Pre-K through grade 2, self-contained special education classrooms, or Whaley School on November 16.

The conditions across Anchorage are currently threatening to push the community's medical capacity beyond its limits, as reflected on our COVID-19 decision monitoring. Additionally, the increasing number of close contacts has the potential to significantly reduce ASD's ability to staff schools with predictability. Delaying in-person learning has been a heartbreaking decision, as we all have become aware that the best way to ensure we educate all children for success in life includes in-person learning.

ASD remains steadfast on getting its students back into schools and will continue its plans to do so when conditions allow. More details about the status of in-person learning for all levels of students and information about additional support services will be shared on November 15. Families in need of services are encouraged to call the District's help line, 907-742-HELP. Help line staff are available to refer those in need to resources for food insecurities, technical assistance, and mental health resources.

In the meantime, please wear masks in public, practice good hygiene, and follow the Municipal and State health mandates. If everyone does their part in reducing the spread of the virus, the community will be on its way to getting students and staff back into the classroom where they love to be.



### Canvas Shells for Make-Up Work for Courses from Quarter 1 and what to expect

First, I would like to thank you for all you do to help your scholar(s) be successful. We at Clark appreciate your hard work and attentiveness to the education of your child(ren). We wanted to reach out and tell you about our extended courses. The learning that takes place is so important, and we want to work with you to make sure your student(s) is successful.

In order to make sure our students are as successful as possible, we are putting together Canvas shells for makeup work for courses from Quarter 1. These courses will be open and available until the end of Quarter 2 for your scholar to complete any assignments he or she did not turn in during the first quarter of school. In order to access these courses, students will need to:

- 1. Contact the teacher about finishing assignments from the first quarter. Students can send an email to the teacher of the course. If you need a reminder of your courses, you can call the school and we will provide that information for you.
- 2. Receive a list of missing assignments from the teacher
- 3. Open their Canvas account through the district website.
- 4. Once the Canvas dashboard (webpage) is open, students will find the Canvas shell that has the course he or she needs.
- 5. These Canvas shells will be labeled "Q1 Content area 6, 7, 8" For example, the science shell is "Q1 Science Make up 6, 7, 8"
- 6. Inside the Canvas shell, students will need to find the module with his or her teacher's name and complete any assignments on the list.

Students will be able to receive full credit for these assignments. In order to make this happen, students and teachers working together will need to complete a process.

- 1. Students will complete missing work and submit it through the Canvas course and let the teacher know when these assignments are turned in.
- 2. Teachers will grade the submitted work and enter a grade.
- 3. A student will send a message to the teacher to let them know when he or she has completed all the assignments that he or she wants/needs to submit.
- 4. When all the assignments are completed, the teacher will contact the registrar, Mrs. Lopez for a grade change form. Mrs. Lopez and the teacher will complete the form and enter the new grade into the system.
- 5. Mrs. Lopez will print a new transcript with the grade changed.
- 6. Mrs. Lopez and the teacher will notify the families of the grade change



### **Return to School Options** For Anyone with COVID-19 Symptoms or a Positive COVID-19 Test Result:

If you test positive, stay home for 10 days after your first symptom or positive test, whichever is earlier. After 10 days, you may return to school when you have not had a fever in 24 hours without fever reducing medicine, as long as your other symptoms are improving.

If you test negative, you may return to school once you have not had a fever in 24 hours without fever reducing medicine as long as your other symptoms are improving.

If you do not get a test, stay home for 10 days. You may return after 10 days if you have not had a fever in 24 hours without fever reducing medicine as long as your other symptoms are improving.

If your healthcare provider determines your symptoms are from something else, you may return to school with a note from your provider as long as you have not had a fever In 24 hours without fever reducing medicine and your other symptoms are improving.

### FREE BREAKFAST AND LUNCH PICK-UP

The Anchorage School District will continue to provide meal service to students enrolled in <u>National School Lunch</u> <u>Program (NSLP) participating schools</u>.

- o Parents or Guardians may elect to pick up meals at one of the below listed distribution centers
- All families that wish to receive meals **must** complete the pre-order form in www.paypams.com. You will be given the option for meal pickup at the distribution locations of your choice.

There is a staff on site at Clark Middle School that is available to help parents sign up for the meals. Simply stop by Clark Middle School or call for assistance.

### **Ordering Instructions**

The pre-order form will take you to PayPams, our delivery vendor. Please select "Sign-up now" to begin the process. After you have signed up, you can use the Login feature. From the next page, select "AK" as your state, and Anchorage School District. Follow the prompts to add your students into the system. Once your students are entered, you can begin the order process:

- 1. Select Delivery Option
  - Pick-up at a Distribution Center : Select the school that is convenient to you
  - List of eligible schools (schools that already have a meal program during a normal school year)
- 2. Click or Tap the "Search" button
- 3. For each student, select the meal date(s) for pick-up
- 4. Click Continue and follow the instructions on the following pages until you receive a confirmation number

### **Pre-Order Deadlines**

• Pick-up: pre-orders must be placed at least four (2) days in advance of the distribution date

### Meal Cost

Meals will be available at no charge to students at eligible schools whether through ASD school or ASD virtual connection to an NSLP brick and mortar schools (schools that usually have a meal program under regular in person school).



### News From the Counseling Department...



Dear Parent or Guardian:

Clark Middle School will participate in the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) in February, 2021. NAEP is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what students know and can do in various subjects. NAEP is administered by the National Center for Education Statistics, within the U.S. Department of Education. NAEP is different from our state assessments because it is a common measure of achievement across the country. The results are released as The Nation's Report Card, which provides information about student achievement to educators, parents, policymakers, and the public.

Your child may take a mathematics or reading assessment.

The assessment takes approximately 2 hours for most students, including transition time and directions.

#### The information collected is used for statistical purposes only.

- Your child's grades will <u>not</u> be affected.
- Students may be excused for any reason, are not required to complete the assessment, and may skip any question.
- While the assessment is voluntary, NAEP depends on student participation to help policymakers improve education. However, if you do not want your child to participate, please notify me in writing by January 5.

There is no need to study in preparation for NAEP, but please encourage your child to do his or her best.
