Activity Bus Riding

Use of the activity is for those students involved in a school sponsored after school activity—generally sports. Any student riding the bus must have a permission slip on file. The bus does not mirror a student's regular bus route. MLMS has 13 daily buses dropping off students, so the activity bus cannot possibly replace that task! The route has long been established and, depending on numbers of students riding any given night, can take up to two hours to complete. Please review the stop you would like your student to use – the driver asks as students board and only stops at those stops for that run.

Isn't Great to Always be Right?

In an advisory class in the spring of last year, students were asked what area needs the most attention at Mirror Lake. There were a few really good responses, but the resounding reply at each grade level was the hallways during passing time. Teachers then asked the follow-up question, which was, "How can we make it better?" Well, students wanted signs posted that offered some kind of traffic flow – and they got them! Now the mantra is, "right side, please" by adults in the halls. So, if you want a conversation starter, ask if your child is "always right" – as on the right side of the hallways! Just this seemingly minor addition has cut down tremendously on students bumping into each other, and reduced running in the halls. Now (most) students get to class on time and in better moods. Students also mentioned it was no fun trying to get to your locker when so many other kids were hanging out in the "bays" (those "U-shaped areas) – now there are signs indicating that kids can't hang out in the locker areas, and adults try to keep them moving. Students suggested placing clocks in the halls as it would cut down on tardies. Voila'--done. Finally, students asked that locker use not be so jammed up – so careful attention was given assigning lockers and we have done what we can.
