We will be continuing to talk about safety, being prepared, and ready. I encourage families to develop and regularly review family safety plans and responses to earthquakes, volcanos, fires, etc. These events happen with little to no warning so the important response is to be prepared and know what to do.

On another note, it has come to my attention that a few parents are learning about and considering **Angelsense**. This is an item that can be clipped to a person with little detection, has a GPS, and the ability to listen in without detection. It cannot be removed without a tool. While I realize one thinks of keeping their child safe, it is important to know that this is against student and parents' privacy rights.
