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Spring time is also PEAKS time. PEAKS is Alaska's state testing for English Language Arts, math and science (5th grade only) proficiency. We will begin next week with this testing. Please give your child positive encouragement to take their time and do their best. Results will be back late spring or early fall. During testing, students will not be allowed to have access to their phone, iWatches or other like technology. This will be at an even more high level of monitoring as it could make their test invalidated. Teachers will develop a plan to ensure that these devices are safely tucked away.

Please talk to your child regarding using phones at school. Students are to turn their phones off or put them on silent and then placed in their backpacks.(Phones go into their backpacks upon entering the building and can come out once outside at the end of the day.) We have phones available in classrooms and in the office for students to call out.

Morning drop off and afternoon pick up seems to be going well. Your patience through this process has been appreciated! Please keep in mind that many families are in a hurry, yet it is important to be focused in the parking lot for student safety. Please watch your speed and refrain from using the phone. Also, thank you for continuing to display your numbers so we can easily see and get your car number logged into our system for students to be dismissed from the classrooms.

I have had parents contact me regarding safety walking home. Please talk to your child about your expectations for safety going to and from school. This includes being kind and refraining from using inappropriate language. Some of the reports of behavior border on not just being unkind, but harassment or bullying. Please report such behaviors so we can work together to ensure that all students feel safe and comfortable coming to and from school.

Tuesday, I sent out an email for my supervisor with a survey seeking input from our community on principal characteristics. Please take time to complete this survey and if you are not able to retrieve it, please contact the school for assistance.

The School Climate and Connectedness Survey has been extended through April 23rd. Please take time to complete the survey, one parent for each school.
