Then you would love to be in our writing classes: this quarter is argument writing, subject-verb agreement, Verbal Moods, and other great punctuation and writing techniques. Our students will be ready to take on 9th-grade writing tasks and we are going to invite you to our class to listen to their convincing argument speeches about something to do with technology.

ELA

We are reading the novel by Lois Lowry, *The Giver*. A seemingly 'Utopian' world which actually turns out to be a dystopian society, until the 14-year-old protagonist saves the day and sacrifices all to make a difference!

Most importantly, students are preparing for the next MAP winter assessment by making sure they know all the necessary vocabulary that can help them navigate the assessment: protagonist/antagonist, conflict, theme, symbolism, and plot elements. Further, we will be reading argument/persuasive essays about driverless cars and other technology topics. Integrated Science 6th - 8th grade

Science is a way of thinking, but especially critical thinking. Scientific studies show that patience, logic, detailed planning, and perseverance leads to a successful life. In a wonderful way, these exact processing skills are naturally found within each science class at Clark Middle School. Clark science teachers strive to reinforce these life-skills in our students by designing carefully planned curriculum.

That said, we will continue to use pre-AP science literacy techniques in each grade level. For Instance - mind maps, OPTIC images, QAR literacy building skills, and 4 Corners are a few learning strategies we use here in Clark Science. Each week students will be able to analyze rigorous and relevant science content, extract the evidence, and defend their claims.

Throughout December 8th grade science will focus on these concepts: geologic time, radiometric dating, layers of the Earth, deposition and strata, evidence of ancient populations, plate tectonics, volcanism, and seismic waves.

7th grade science will focus on these concepts: Structure and function of living things, computer science, and waves of digitized signals.
