
# **BATTLE OF THE BOOKS**

The students successfully completed several book challenges, which means they were able to persuade judges as to why their answers were correct. Awesome job, Clark Falcons!








# Sports physical at Clark Middle School






Hello Clark Families,



Yay! It's Flower Blooming Season! This month in Language Arts, students will be concluding the novel Walk Two Moons with an evaluation assessment of Unit 2: Powers of Change by writing an informative literary response. In writing, students we will be continuing Unit 3 Identifying Claims in Arguments and concluding the unit with writing an argumentative essay. Students are also learning how to eloquently and effectively quote/ reference information from a text in their writing to enhance their writing abilities. In Science students will be continuing learning about energy, concentrating on potential and kinetic energy, and moving into different types of energy focusing this month on solar and thermal energy. They are also exploring different energy sources as well. In math students will be learning how to incorporate addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division using decimal numbers.



#### **ELA/Writing**

Our unit for Writing and ELA on "The Challenge to Make a Difference," includes many examples and information about how our young people of today are making the world a better place. We are also exploring poetry (FOUND Poems) and poetry devices: metaphor, simile, and personification. We are utilizing Flocabulary, Peardeck, Canvas, and Kahoots to implement fun and engaging activities into this unit. The students will present a multimedia campaign to the class: "Truth to Power Protest Projects" and we will invite you. The dates for the presentations are Feb 27th and Feb 28th.

We continue to learn *writing and grammar techniques* to help our students write quality essays: transitions, organizational structures, Introductions, body paragraphs, and conclusions. We are applying these techniques to multimedia presentations, using correct grammar and spelling, organization flow, bulleted information for presentations, and verbal and speaking strategies.


In Science 8 we have converted the science room into Mars for our project "Destination Mars". For this long-term project, students will think critically and use the engineering design process to solve Mars-based problems. In order to do this the students will program and design a build around their very own Mars rover. March into April will include scientific and fundamental concepts on genetics and the diversity of life. In Social Studies, students will be transitioning into an intensive study of Colonization, Revolution, and creation of the United States of America. The focus of this look-back in history will be to have students look forward to the next stage of human colonization in space. English Language Arts is finishing *The Giver* and *Fahrenheit 451* by the end of Quarter Three. When we return from spring break, we will be completing Module 2 for the end of March and moving into Holocaust studies in Module 3 by examining *Night*, by Elie Wisel.Writing will be finishing looking at writing historical fiction narratives and moving into writing their own poetry.
