
This past fall Birchwood ABC established the goal of 95% attendance for all students throughout the school year. Our current attendance rate so far this school year is only 94.19% and has dropped into the average range. In an effort to improve attendance communication our school has adopted a more specific attendance policy. This policy was hand delivered to all parents at conferences. The improvement of a student's attendance cannot be achieved without the dedication and commitment of families to making sure that their children are here on time every day!

Please let us know if there is anything that we can do to assist you with improving your child's attendance.

- Excellent = 0-3 absences (98-100%)
- Good = 4-9 absences (95-98%)
- Average = 10-14 absences (92-95%)
- Poor = 15-19 absences (89-92%)
- Severe = more than 20 absences (>89%)



The PEAKS assessment involves 3-6 grade students. 3rd and 4th grade students will test reading on March 31st and math on April 1st. 4th grade students will test science on April 2nd. 5th and 6th grade students will test reading on April 7th and Math on April 8th. PEAKS Testing Window, Content Areas and Testing Times

2020 State Testing Window: March 30-May 1

ASD Window: March 30-April 10 (Make-ups may occur at any time March 31- May 1)



PEAKS (Performance Evaluation for Alaska's Schools) will be administered to Anchorage students in Grades 3-9 (English language arts and mathematics) and grades 4, 8 and 10 (science) during the weeks of March 30-April 10. Schools have flexibility in providing the test to students to minimize the impact on instructional time. Make-ups are allowed any time between March 31-May 1. Students are not allowed to complete more than one full content area in a day.

Testing times* to complete PEAKS vary by grade level and content area. While the assessment is untimed, approximate testing times by content area and grade level are included in the table below. Using these estimates, ASD has included a recommended minimum test session length.

Guidelines from the CDC for keeping healthy:

Stay home when you are sick.


