Dear ASD Families and Employees,

Due to students being out of school December 3-7 following the November 30 earthquake, a plan was approved by the School Board on January 22, 2018, to account for the days of instruction missed. 2018-19 Revised School Year Calendar.

The days associated with the February Parent-Teacher Conferences will be utilized as student instructional days. Half days originally scheduled for February 20, 21, and 22 are regular full day instructional time for students. 
Health/SEL

Differences in Cold or Flu

Symptoms	Cold	Flu
Fever	Rare	Characteristic, high
		(100-102 degrees F); lasts three to four days
Headache	Rare	Prominent
General Aches, Pains	Slight	Usual; often severe
Fatigue, Weakness	Quite mild	Can last up to two to three weeks
Extreme Exhaustion	Never	Early and prominent
Stuffy Nose	Common	Sometimes
Sneezing	Usual	Sometimes
Sore Throat	Common	Sometimes
Chest Discomfort,	Mild to moderate;	Common; can become severe
Cough	hacking cough	
Complications	Sinus congestion	Bronchitis, pneumonia;
	or earache	can be life-threatening
Prevention	Good hygiene	Annual flu shot or FluMist
Treatment	Only	Antiviral drugs (Tamiflu or
