Mears 8th Graders Tour Holocaust Museum



This week, Mears 8th graders attended a virtual tour of The Holocaust Museum LA. The tour was led by Mr. Mitch Kreitenberg, whose family members were prisoners in Auschwitz during World War II. The tour offers Mears students powerful first-person testimony about the history of the Holocaust, a subject they read about in Elie Wiesel's famous novel, *Night*.
