Cell Phone/Electronic Device Policy: Big Changes Semester 2



Beginning on January 3rd, the first day of semester 2, students will no longer be able to use their cell phones or electronic devices in the hallways, multipurpose room, or any other school areas between the hours of 8:00 AM and 2:45 PM. Teachers will remain in complete control of electronic device use in their classrooms.

We ask that you also discuss this huge change with your student to ensure a successful transition to the new policy. Please review the following information for consequences if students violate the policy that starts on January 3rd, 2022; <u>we depend on your support</u> for the successful implementation of this new policy.

As part of this support, we ask that you communicate with your student through the office.. When you text or call your student during class, it can create a behavioral concern for the staff member that does not help provide the best possible educational experience.

For infractions in the hallway/MPR, we will use the following structure and use the updated electronic device spreadsheet and Q. to keep track of related behavior:

- 1st infraction: phone taken and returned by same staff to student.
- 2nd infraction: phone taken provided to administration for parent pickup.
- 3rd infraction: phone taken provided to administration for parent pickup + work detail.
- 4th infraction:: phone taken provided to administration for parent pick up+In School Suspension (ISS).
- 5th infraction: phone taken provided to administration for parent pick up+ 2 ISS and mandatory meeting with administration for behavioral plan consideration.

Bag and Backpack-Free Hallways: Beginning January 3rd



Mears Families:

With the return to two-way hallways and full locker use, the administration has decided to eliminate the use of bags and backpacks of any kind in the hallways starting January 3rd. We've made this decision for three reasons:

- 1. Safety: We recognize that a school without bags backpacks in the hallways is inherently safer because items are visible to staff at all times .
- 2. Clarity: Despite our best efforts to define appropriately-sized bags and backpacks this quarter, students continue to have a hard time distinguishing; by eliminating backpacks we're able to ensure a crystal-clear message and prevent behavioral infractions related to bag/backpack use.
- 3. Opportunity: Now students have the opportunity to fully employ their lockers, making backpack use unnecessary.

In short, we're convinced that keeping our hallways bag and backpack free starting January 3rd will result in many benefits for our students.

FLASH FICTION or The Super Short Story



- Tell a story in 200 words or less.
- <u>Categories</u>:
 - > "What's App with that?"
 - > "Dude, the mullet is back!"
 - > "Help! I'm in cell phone jail."
- Deadline: Tuesday, December 14th.

Tips for Writing Flash Fiction:

Stories cannot exceed 200 words.

Although this is a very short story, stories still need a beginning, middle and end, developed characters, a defined setting and a clear conflict.

Complete an outline provided before beginning your draft.

Introduce the main character, setting and conflict immediately. Think action, dialogue, description.

Keep the number of characters to a minimum. The story is too short to develop many characters.

Make every word count. Use active verbs.

Try writing out your story draft without worrying about the 200-word limit. Once you have a rough draft written, go back and eliminate words, phrases, or entire sentences that do not move the story forward.

Once you get closer to 200 words, go back and delete unnecessary words, especially "thens," "thats," "thes," and "ands."

Consider a surprise or a sudden twist at the end.
