On behalf of Mears teachers and staff, I want to begin this newsletter by extending our heartfelt greetings to all of our students and their families. It goes without saying that we miss our students tremendously and look forward to reconnecting with them as soon as possible.

As you are all well aware, the challenges we all face as a result of the coronavirus have brought about unprecedented change and disruption to our normal lives and

routines. The closure of our schools, which is estimated to be impacting 38 million students nationwide, is but one of countless examples that show how severely the landscape has been altered by the health risks of Covid-19.

At Mears, and throughout Anchorage School District, spent a good deal of time this week reaching out to make personal connections with our families. Maintaining strong relationships with our students and their families remains our highest priority. Our teachers and staff deeply value the conversations we had with our families and students. We especially wish to express our sincere concern for all of those in our community who are grappling with uncertainty related to childcare, food security, health, social and emotional wellbeing, and unemployment. Please know that we are doing all that we can, with assistance from district leadership, to address these needs as best we can. To better ensure the safety and health of teachers and staff, we are all meeting remotely now by Zoom video conference. Families and students should be aware that a tremendous amount of work is being done, despite our inability to meet in person at school. Similarly, district leadership are meeting on a daily basis, doing our best to attend to immediate needs, as well as preparing for our next steps as a school and district.

Mears Introduces Enrichment Activities for the week of March 23-27, 2020



For the week of March 23-27, Mears teachers have organized a landing pad of enrichment opportunities. The information, which includes educational activities from all departments, is located on the homepage of the <u>Mears Middle School Website</u>. Once there, just click on the "landing pad," which will take you to the page with all Mears' academic departments. With the help of Mears librarian, Ms. Heather Fleming, teachers have uploaded a number of fun and engaging activities that are designed to keep our students active and engaged. For the coming week, none of these activities are required by teachers, nor will they be graded. Rather, they are recommended opportunities for students to continue their learning and growth while the school and district prepare for the coming weeks.

Health Services

Student Nutrition

ASD Student Nutrition will continue food distribution of pre-packaged breakfast and lunch meals for any child 18 or younger at established food service sites. Mobile food service routes will remain scheduled to accommodate students and families unable to access the school distribution sites. Educational Resources

Over these two weeks, ASD is focusing on supplemental learning activities for students. This will not take the place of regular classroom instruction, and therefore assignments will not be required or graded during this time. However, they are important, and we encourage you to engage in learning with your child. The Family Resources link (https://www.asdk12.org/Page/15108) on the ASD COVID-19 website includes Educational Resources. This is meant to give families ideas and activities that they can do at home during the two-week closure. In addition to the District website, teachers will share supplemental learning activities with their students and families. ASD teachers have been working hard connecting with their students and families to assess readiness to continue educational activities during the school closure period.

As of today, ASD staff has logged over 41,000 phone calls to families! Here is some of the information that ASD has gathered:

- 91 percent of households report adequate childcare during school closure time
- 87 percent of households have high speed internet at home
- 4 percent have no internet at home

In regard to devices:

- 41 percent have a desktop computer at home
- 70 percent have a laptop computer at home
- 57 percent have a tablet at home
- 69 percent have smartphone with data
- 5 percent have no devices at home
- 65 percent can print at home

Evidenced by the data, some families have multiple devices.

ASD and its schools will use this information moving forward should we need to develop longer-term plans for distance learning across the District.
