



The teachers on Team Echo prepare for Open House on Thursday, Sept. 5th, by decorating the first floor wall with their favorite quotes. What's your favorite quote?



- If your student is going to be out please call the attendance line, 566-3300 to report the absence. Make sure to spell your students name!!
- If you are picking your student up early Please send a note with them to school so they can get a blue pass from the front office. This will save classroom interruption and less wait time when you come to the office to sign them out.
- Attendance Calls if your student was marked absent have them check with their teachers to find out which period to get the correction taken care of.
- End of the day calls Please allow the office runners at least 20 min. before the end of the day to deliver messages promptly to your student to avoid last minute confusion
- **Prearranged absences** Request forms are available in the student service's office for absences of 5 or more days. Missed homework will be requested from teachers but it is the students' responsibility to make sure all school work is complete.
- **Phone calls –** Please be patient with ringing phone lines. The office has very busy times so leave a message and we will get to it as soon as we can!

Baby wipes	Non-perishable foods, such as:
White vinegar	Cereals
Baking soda	Baby foods
Duct tape	Baby formula
Heavy Duty work gloves	Gatorade
Bleach	Apple juice
Handi-Wipes	Orange juice
Paper plates/cups	Canned milk
Plastic ware	Soups
"Bag of Rags" (Costco or auto supply stores)	Canned tuna
Paper towels	Canned chicken
Toilet paper	Canned beef (Costco)
Laundry soap	Salt/pepper
Dish soap	Dog and cat food
Boxed matches	Condiments: ketchup, mustard, mayo
New packs of underwear and socks.	Toothpaste, tooth brushes

These are just a few ideas based on the needs indicated by first responders, working in the Talkeetna/Caswell area.

People have lost their homes, which means EVERYTHING. Basic items we take for granted are gone.

Ex: A can opener is needed to open canned goods.
