# Cell Phone/Electronic Device Policy: Big Changes Semester 2



Beginning on January 3rd, the first day of semester 2, students will no longer be able to use their cell phones or electronic devices in the hallways, multipurpose room, or any other school areas between the hours of 8:00 AM and 2:45 PM. Teachers will remain in complete control of electronic device use in their classrooms.

We ask that you also discuss this huge change with your student to ensure a successful transition to the new policy. Please review the following information for consequences if students violate the policy that starts on January 3rd, 2022; <u>we depend on your support</u> for the successful implementation of this new policy:

# For infractions in the hallway/MPR, we will use the following structure and use the updated electronic device spreadsheet and Q. to keep track of related behavior:

- 1st infraction: phone taken and returned by same staff to student.
- 2nd infraction: phone taken provided to administration for parent pickup.
- 3rd infraction: phone taken provided to administration for parent pickup + work detail.
- 4th infraction:: phone taken provided to administration for parent pick up+In School Suspension (ISS).
- 5th infraction: phone taken provided to administration for parent pick up+ 2 ISS and mandatory meeting with administration for behavioral plan consideration.

In the interest of maintaining an orderly and safe school, we acknowledge that Mears, like most schools across the District and country, is experiencing an uptick in physical behavior. While we address each and every one of these events with serious consequences, we want to reassure families that we're increasing our supervision to mitigate this unfortunate national trend. Additionally, we continue to speak to all of the students and provide consequences for recording and standing by during these tremendously inappropriate disruptions of the school day. We also continue to address the behaviors that can lead to these events, and the hardworking staff at Mears has prevented countless altercations with this proactivity.

Finally, we appreciate each of you speaking to your child, reminding him/her that if they see something concerning, they should let an adult in the building know, so we can help.
