Quick Reminders

Lottery

This is a friendly reminder that all children (including those with siblings already in the school) that enter Northern Lights ABC come in through the online lottery process.

You may access the online lottery through your current ASD student's Zangle Parent Connect account. If they do not have a current ASD account you may apply by making an online lottery account on the ASD website.

Children are eligible to go through the lottery if they will be 5 years of age on or before September 1 of the year that they will start kindergarten.

Important Notice - Middle School

October 1, 2019

Dear NLABC Families,

Your ASD middle school student will have a STAR Prevention Specialist visit their classroom during the week of October 28- November 1st to talk about the components of Sexual Assault & Consent and what healthy relationships look like. A teacher will also be in the classroom during all lessons.

STAR's Sexual Assault & Consent curricula is approved by ASD and intended to serve as a supplement to the lessons being taught in the ASD on healthy relationships.

During this presentation student learned important information such as:

- STAR Services
- The Alaska Statute definition of Sexual Assault
- The components of consent
- The ability to recognize that it is never the fault of the person who was harmed
- Identify inaccurate beliefs surrounding sexual assault
- Empower students to take steps in their own community to prevent sexual violence
- Student confidence in the ability to respond to unhealthy situations

These lessons provide students with a better understanding of safe vs. unsafe behaviors and to promote healthy conversations with adults in their lives surrounding boundaries and values. Additionally, STAR seeks to provide a common language for students and identify who to ask for help when it is needed. If you have questions or would like to learn more about what STAR does in the community, please contact us.

STAR services STAR identifies to students that all STAR staff, like their teachers, are mandated reporters and that it is part of our job to help keep young adults safe. We discuss the purpose of our crisis line and how we help others in the community through advocacy and support.

Any sexual contact STAR identifies that sexual contact is a range of behaviors that can fall anywhere from hand holding to intercourse, and encourage students to identify what behaviors they feel safe and comfortable with.

<u>Sexual Assault</u> any sexual contact gained through force, threats, trickery, manipulation or coercion. We do not talk about what is prosecutable.

Important Notice - Middle School

<u>Consent</u> for there to be consent each component must be present: voluntary, active, aware, and age. STAR makes it very clear that we are not encouraging sexual activity, and that we are not talking about our own or the school districts values, as those are specific to individuals and STAR supports youth in the discussion with their families surrounding the topic of values and setting boundaries.

How to help a friend what you can do if a friend tells you they are experiencing or exhibiting any of the components of sexual assault.

The heart of STAR's client services is our statewide crisis line, which is staffed 24 hours a day, including holidays and weekends. Important Notice - Grades K to 6

October 1, 2019

Dear NLABC Families,

Your ASD student will have a STAR Community Educator visit their classroom on the week of October 28-November 1st to talk about personal body safety. STAR's Personal Safety curricula is approved by ASD and intended to serve as a supplement to health lessons on personal body safety and harm prevention and is a must teach topic. A teacher will also be in the classroom during all lessons.

During this presentation for K-6 students learned important information such as:

- "It's MY body, and I like it!"
- The three kinds of touches: Safe, Ouch, Secret
- The difference between a Secret Touch and a Clean and Healthy Touch
- The Personal Safety Rule NO-GO-TELL and who to tell
- How to identify Trusted Adults at home, school and in the community The difference between tattling and telling. Tattling is about getting someone else in trouble. Telling or reporting is about keeping someone safe.

These lessons provide students with a better understanding of safe vs. unsafe behaviors and touches. Additionally, STAR seeks to provide a common language for students and identify who to ask for help when it is needed. A Safe Touch can make us feel happy, loved, proud or silly.

Everyone can see and know about safe touches. A safe touch might be a high five, a hug, or a pat on the back. Everyone has the right to say no to any kind of touch. An Ouch Touch is a touch that hurts our bodies and they can make us feel sad, mad, and might even make us cry. An ouch touch is pulling hair, a hit, a push, a bite, or a kick. No one is allowed to give you ouch touches (and you are not allowed to give them to anyone else either!) A Secret Touch is when someone wants a child to look at or touch their body or wants to look at or touch a child's body (especially the parts of the body covered by a bathing suit) and tells a child never to tell anyone and to keep the touch a secret. A Clean and Healthy Touch is the only time anyone can look at or touch a child's private parts. A clean and healthy touch might look like help with the bathroom, bathing, or getting a checkup at the doctors. Everyone can know about a clean and healthy touch, they are not secret.

Important Notice - Grades K to 6

The Personal Safety Rule is a rule we can use if someone is touching our bodies in a way that we don't like or doing anything that makes us feel unsafe or uncomfortable. If someone is touching our bodies in a way that we don't like or doing anything that makes us feel unsafe or uncomfortable we can ... Say NO in a firm voice, GO to a safe place as soon as possible, and most importantly TELL a trusted adult. We identified Trusted Adults. Students usually tell us that their family members, school staff and members of our community, such as a STAR Community Educator, Doctors or Police Officers, are people they can tell if they need help.

During the lessons there not be any body parts (anatomy) be labeled or discussed. The samples will show students in swimwear and will use general terms called private areas. The acronym for STAR will not be used as well.
