

Nurse's Notes

FAQ for Parents/Guardians:

1. What is the Out-of-State Travel protocol? Staff/students have two options for returning to work/school:

Option 1: Submit proof of a negative test taken within 72 hours before arrival. Must follow strict social distancing for 5 days after arrival.

Option 2: Arrive in Alaska without a test and receive a test at the airport at no cost.

Self-quarantine until a negative test returns. All travelers with negative results from the arrival test must follow strict social distancing for 5 days after their arrival in Alaska.

A resident may still decline a test; however, they must quarantine for the 14 days after arrival.

An Alaska resident may travel outside of the state for less than 72 hours with the following requirements. No test or quarantine is required.

Note: Children 10 and under are exempt from the testing requirement. However, untested children traveling with a parent or guardian must remain in the same status for the same duration as the parent/guardian (self-quarantine and/or strict social distancing).

1. What if a student/staff is symptomatic?

Option 1: If you test positive, stay home for 10 days after your first symptom or positive test, whichever is earlier. After 10 days, you may return to school when you have not had a fever in 24 hours without fever reducing medicine, as long as your other symptoms are improving. Positive test results are required to be sent to school nurse.

Option 2: If you test negative, you may return to school once you have not had a fever in 24 hours without fever reducing medicine as long as your other symptoms are improving. Negative test results are required to be sent to school nurse.

Option 3: If you do not get a test, stay home for 10 days. You may return after 10 days if you have not had a fever in 24 hours without fever reducing medicine as long as your other symptoms are improving.

Option 4: If your healthcare provider determines your symptoms are from something else, you may return to school with a note from your provider as long as you have not

had a fever In 24 hours without fever reducing medicine and your other symptoms are improving.

- 1. Each positive case within a classroom will be investigated to determine if other students/staff are close contacts. The Centers for Disease Control defines a close contact as any individual who was within 6 feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes starting from two days before illness onset or, for asymptomatic patients, two days prior to positive specimen collection until the time the patient is isolated. Close contacts will be notified and will be required to complete a 10-day quarantine period to monitor for symptoms.
- 2.A student who is identified as a close contact, will do a PCR test during the quarantine period on day 5, if the test is negative he/she can return to school on day 8. Without testing, they are required to quarantine for 10days. Negative test results are required to be sent to school nurse.
- **1.Where can asymptomatic students get tested for Covid-19?** Asymptomatic testing cannot be done at any of our ASD sites. Visit the free muni testing sites. https://anchoragecovidtest.org/
- **2.Where can symptomatic students get tested?** Students, staff or household members are encouraged to signup@ covidsecureapp.com

- **3.**? No, the siblings of the close contact are considered contacts of a close contact and are not required to quarantine. Siblings can attend school as long as parents continue to monitor siblings at home for any symptoms. Parents can choose to get all the siblings tested, that's recommended but not required.
- **4.**? Are the siblings allowed to attend school? If a sibling is symptomatic and has other siblings at school, please notify school nurse. The asymptomatic siblings can attend school but it is HIGHLY RECCOMENDED they get tested prior to returning to school. If parents choose not to test, parents should continue to observe asymptomatic siblings for any symptoms.

NORTHERN LIGHTS DRESS CODE

The Northern Lights ABC School expects the students and personnel to have high standards of conduct and appropriate dress and appearance. The purpose of our dress code is to keep everyone's focus on academics. Anything that is done or worn for shock value or to attract special attention is not acceptable.

The Principal makes the final decision in these situations. • Between the hours of 8:00 AM and 3:00 PM all cell phones, MP-3, CD players and other electronic devices will be turned off and concealed. Otherwise they will be confiscated. Parents will be responsible for retrieving them from the office.

- Students may not use unnatural hair dye or coloring (pink, purple, blue, green yellow, orange etc.).
- · No permanent tattoos or other body art.
- Nail polish and make-up is not permitted in grades K-6. Middle school students may use a minimal amount of make-up and only clear nail polish.
- Due to safety reasons, dangling earrings are not permitted for any grade level. No facial piercing of any kind, except in the ears, will be allowed during school hours for students.
- Outer garments, including coats, jackets, hats, hoods or bandanas may not be worn in the building during class times. A fitted sweater or sweatshirt may be worn in class.
- No flip-flops, soccer slides, slippers, platform shoes or 'Heelys.' Shoes must be appropriate for the weather.
 - · No sunglasses or non-prescription glasses will be worn in the building.
 - Clothing will fit properly (not to exceed one (1) size beyond the correct size) without bagging, sagging or having any modifications. Pants should be able to stay above the hipbones without a belt.
 - Undergarments are not to be seen at any time. This includes a bra if a shirt gaps (check when leaning forward) and underwear seen above the top of pants, including when seated.
 - T-shirts with sleeves cut off, shirts that are revealing, sheer, mesh, or skintight are not allowed. Nor are tank tops, halter-tops, crop tops, or any shirt that leaves the midriff exposed, including when seated. Sleeveless shirts that are no narrower than the natural shoulder seam (about 3" wide) will be permitted.
 - · Clothing may not contain inappropriate messages or logos for drugs, alcohol or tobacco.
 - · All clothing will have finished hems, be clean and without holes.
 - • Skirts, skorts and shorts will be no higher than 1" above the knee.
 - Students dresseinappropriately will need to change their clothes. They will sit in the office until
 proper attire is brought to them. This will be accomplished by having parents bring the correct
 clothing to school. The student will attend study hall (detention for middle school) to compensate
 for missed instruction time.
