

Dear Parents,

We're off to a great start this school year! Lots of exciting things going on here already. I look forward to seeing everyone next week at Open House on Thursday at 5:30 PM in the GYM.

One of our early tasks this fall here on campus has been to assess all of our K-5 students in reading. Students in grades K-2 participated in AIMSweb screening, and our 3-5 graders all took the MAP test.

AIMSweb: Grades K-2

The assessment measures early literacy, early numeracy, and math computation in grades K-2. The results are used to measure learning status and growth within the school year, to support identification of students who are at-risk and in need of interventions and/or enrichment, and for program evaluation and accountability.

MAP Growth: Grades 3-12

The assessment measures students' achievement on the standards and is designed to provide detailed information to better inform classroom instruction to include identifying students in need of intervention or acceleration. MAP Growth shows how much growth has occurred between testing events and projects proficiency on PEAKS.

Teachers will soon be sharing the results of our school-wide fall assessments. We'll use these results to better address the individual learning needs of all students. It will also help us formulate our WIN (What I Need) intervention groups. I encourage all parents to monitor their student's progress and standing relative to grade-level benchmark throughout the year.

W.I.N. Groups

W.I.N. stands for "What I Need." For 40 minutes each day classes will be broken down into smaller W.I.N. groups. The majority of these groups will be focused on building reading fluency and comprehension. If your child is meeting grade level expectations in all areas of reading, he/she may be placed in a group that focuses on a different area of need.

Our W.I.N. staff this year includes Kathy
Bostock (Reading
Interventionist), Teresa
Bishop (AEL), Karen
Gauthier (Title VI), all
classroom teachers and
kindergarten teaching
assistants. Special
education teachers and
teaching assistants may
also be working with groups
during this time.

Data, data, data!

We have been very busy these last few weeks getting to know your child(ren)'s reading levels. All kindergarten children have taken an assessment that measures their knowledge of letter names and letter sounds. All first grade students have taken an assessment that measures their ability to read 2 or letter nonsense (made-up) words using their knowledge of phonics. All second grade students have taken a reading fluency test that measures how many words they can read correctly in one minute. All students in grades 3-5 have taken the MAP reading and math test.

All students in grade 2 will also complete a comprehensive phonics screening assessment one-on-one. Currently we are done with about half of these assessments. After second grade is complete, we will assess all students in grades 3-5 that are struggling with reading.

Why do we complete so many assessments?

We do this so we can create a plan for every child that addresses his or her own individual needs in reading. These plans will be carried out by the classroom teacher, their "Walkto-Read" teacher (if different from their classroom teacher, special education, Indian Education, ELA, and other reading instruction staff.

We will meet in teams this Wednesday to look at each child's data to determine the best W.I.N. group placement. If you are interested in learning about your child's data, fell free to contact their classroom teacher or me. We are happy to share current levels and things you can do at home to support your child's learning.


