Message from the Principal

Happy New Year Scenic Park Families!

I hope you all enjoyed the winter break with family and friends. It is great to be back at school and continue to observe the amazing learning happening at Scenic Park!

As we begin the second half of the school year, we will continue to focus our attention on student attendance. I can't stress the importance of students attending school. Attendance will continue to be monitored throughout the remainder of the school year. We appreciate your support in getting your child to school.

Students will begin an ice-skating unit in PE. Please see the flier with more information regarding appropriate gear for ice skating. We will culminate the ice-skating unit with our family skate night on Friday, January 27th, followed by our Skate-A-Thon on, Friday, February 3rd.
