

# Rilke Schule Academic Policy Committee Treasurer Report Thursday, January 19, 2023

#### **Summary**

Principal Strauch submitted our initial FY24 budget to ASD in December. We are awaiting any follow-up inquiries and/or official approval. The post-OASIS count revenue projections have been updated by ASD with Rilke Schule receiving an unexpected additional funding amount of \$69k. We had anticipated a budget reduction due to our OASIS count enrollment numbers being less than budgeted. While this did occur, the reduction was more than offset by the final year of the State's Hold Harmless funding. In the coming months, the Facilities, Strategic Planning and Budget/Finance committees expect to collaborate in identifying the next steps in Rilke's long-term financial success.


#### 2022-23 Financial Performance/Outlook (FY23)

Unallocated funds as of June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022 were \$823k. The adopted budget for FY23 is \$4.6M, however, this budget was built upon an estimated enrollment number of 463. The OASIS count in October resulted in an enrollment number of 437 for Rilke. As stated above, this resulted in an expected enrollment loss on the revised budget. Fortunately, the final year of the State's Hold Harmless funding offset this enrollment loss. With the heavy lifting of the budget behind us, the Treasurer and Principal intend to focus more on forecasting significant expenditures for the remainder of the 2022-23 school year.

December year-to-date general fund expenditures are roughly 40% of our total forecasted spend. If we can continue to manage the general fund spending on this path, we are forecasted to end the year below the revised budget amount. Significant non-personnel costs incurred from July to December were related rent, utilities, general liability insurance and the Rilke intern program. All operating costs continue to be scrutinized in an effort to determine the most effective way to fund Rilke's necessary expenditures.


Rilke's student activity fees are another avenue we are exploring how best to utilize as a supplement to ASD's budget. Per Principal Strauch, we have received 75-80% of expected student activity fees thus far this school year.

## General Fund Only FY22 vs FY23 Actual Expenditures





# FY23 General Fund Expenditures Monthly by Expense Category




