At the beginning of the year, your child should be able to...

- Understand the relationship between multiplication and division
- Multiply and divide up to 100
- Solve word problems using multiplication and division
- Develop and understanding of fractions as numbers
- Understand and calculate area and perimeter
- Solve problems using measurement, including time, volume and mass



Future Content Skills

Next year, your child will...

- Multiply and Divide with whole numbers, fractions, and decimals
- Multiply and Divide using exponents
- Add, Subtract, Multiply, and Divide with fractions
- Develop strategies for solving long division problems
- Explore geometric figures in 2D and 3D
- Convert like measurements within a system (metric, customary)
- Represent and interpret data

4th Grade Core Content Skills

Operations and Algebraic Thinking

- Use the four operations with whole numbers to solve problems.
- Gain familiarity with factors and multiples.
- Generate and analyze patterns.

Number and Operations in Base Ten

- Generalize place value understanding for multidigit whole numbers.
- Use place value understanding and properties of operations to perform multi-digit arithmetic.

Number and Operations—Fractions

- Extend understanding of fraction equivalence and ordering.
- Build fractions from unit fractions by applying and extending previous understandings of operations on whole numbers.
- Understand decimal notation for fractions, and compare decimal fractions.

Measurement and Data

- Solve problems involving measurement and conversion of measurements from a larger unit to a smaller unit.
- Represent and interpret data.
- Geometric measurement: understand concepts of angle and measure angles.

Geometry

• Draw and identify lines and angles, and classify shapes by properties of their lines and angles.

Things to do with your child

- * Play basic multiplication and division fact games
- *Relate fractions to real world situations
- * Identify 2D shapes together and talk about the features
- * Explore grocery store math (money, decimals, estimation, receipts, prices, serving sizes, weight, and capacity)
- * MEASURE! Give kids a chance to find length, find weight, find capacity, tell time, and use standard units to describe the world.
- *Solve computation problems in many different ways.
- *Locate and examine angles around you
