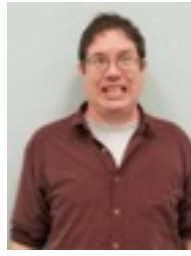

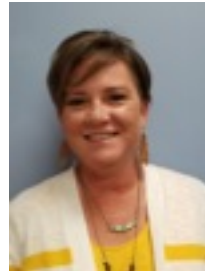

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for winter. Warm boots, jacket, hat, gloves and waterproof pants will be needed. I encourage you to label your child's gear, even the older students, with their name so if lost we can help find it and get it back to the rightful owner. Look for reflective outside gear or add-ons that will make your child more easily seen in the dark along the roads. We go outside to -10 degrees so we want all students dressed for the conditions. Students will need a doctor's note to stay inside due to injury or other health concerns.

School and home working together, as a team, provides the best support for your child's education. Parent involvement comes in many ways. Talking about the importance of education and how it will help them reach their hopes and dreams is one place to start. Providing a regular academic time to complete homework, unfinished school work, read or practice other skills, helps reinforce that learning doesn't stop when you leave school. Also, providing an opportunity for extra curricular activities as in organized sports, drama, or music enrichment.

Many of you may have heard me mention or talk about Social Emotional Learning. Ursa Minor staff infuses many strategies or methods into their teaching and classroom environment that promote the development of social emotional skills for our students. Today I would like to talk about developing a growth mind set in our students. If you are looking for a great book to read, read *Growth Mindset* by Carol Dweck. Here you will see different ways things to say to your children to reinforce that success comes from knowing that mistakes are part of learning and we learn from mistakes. It takes hard work to learn and grow, we can grow our brain, and much more. Look in our newsletter for some others ways to praise your children to get yourself started! I am excited about this and if you want to talk more about it, let me know. I would be happy to share what I know.
