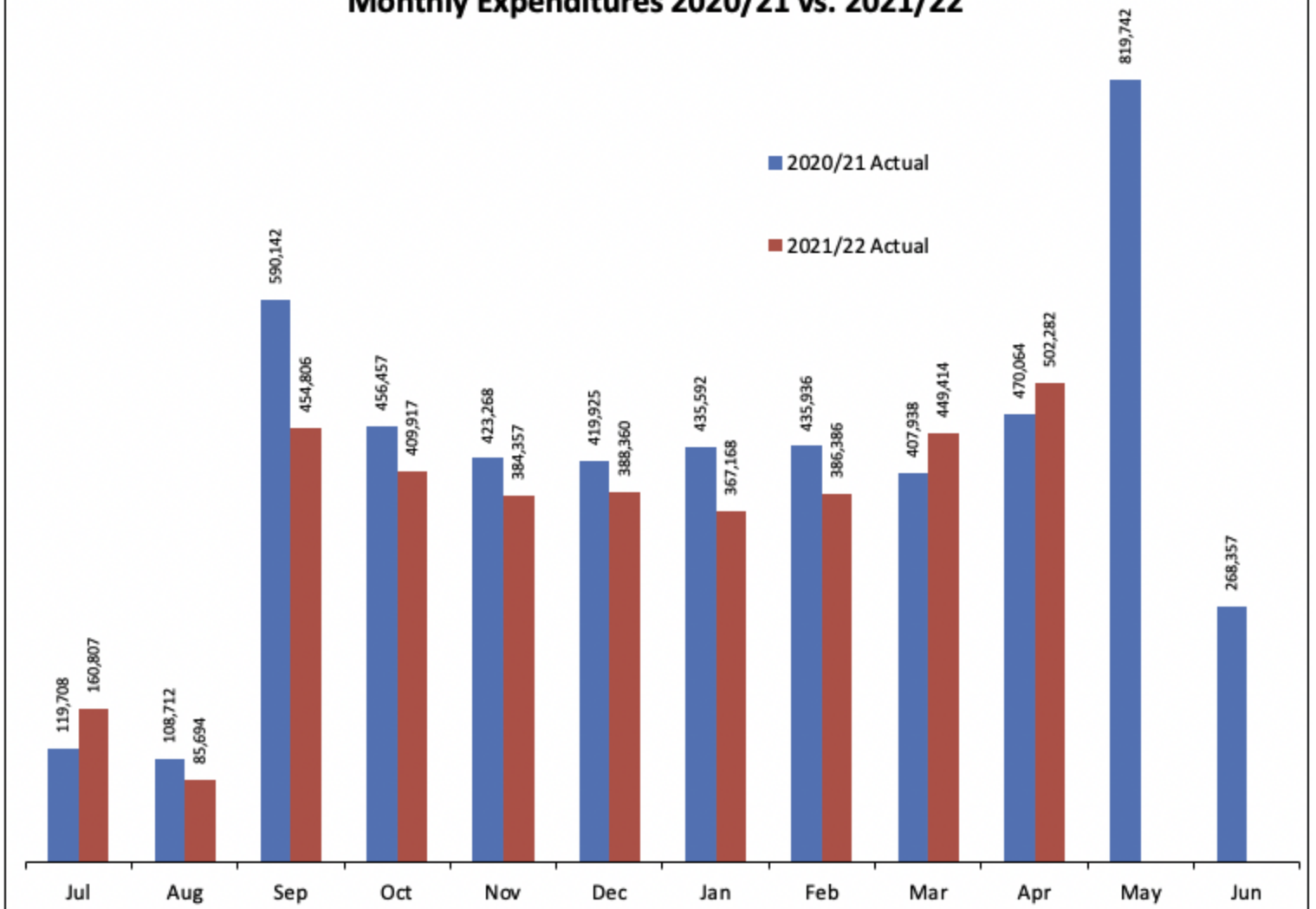

APC Principal's Report

Culture-	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ignite- Rilke Enrollment- 18 total students (1) @ 2nd, (9)@ 4th, (6) @5th, (2)@ 6th <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The IGNITE program is an enrichment based pull-out program for gifted learners who have met the eligibility criteria under the Anchorage School District's Plan of Service for Gifted Students. The program is available to students in grades 2-6. IGNITE students are in their regular classrooms for core instruction and attend IGNITE classes for a 2-3 hour session per week. Rilke Students are currently bussed to participate. ○ Current concerns regarding missing a half day of English or German every week, potentially miss all or a majority of specialized classes depending on scheduling. ○ I haven't heard back from any Charter Schools that participate. Responses explain that they believe the uniqueness of their programs provide the enrichment offered by ignite already. ○ Potential survey to parents if they would leave Rilke because Rilke opted out of Ignite ○ Mixed reports from teachers- German teachers and Specialists surveyed for impact • Ann Weese, Rilke Intern Coordinator is looking for Intern hosts for the 2022-23 school year. We are projecting 5 for fall semester and 4 for the spring semester. • Wrapping up the end of the school year with the return of many traditions ranging from Wandertag, Field Day, all school picture, along with many field trips.
