Charlotte and Sophie were the winners of the essay contest! Congratulations to all of 5th grade!









### Counselor's Corner

In the Anchorage School District educators discuss about how important assets are to our students. The more assets a student has the more likely the student will have healthy behaviors. There are 20 external and 20 internal assets.

External assets are divided in specific categories: support, empowerment, boundaries and expectations and constructive use of time. In the support category the assets are: family support, positive family communication, other adult relationships, caring neighborhood/community, caring school climate and parent involvement in school. In the empowerment category the assets are: community values youth, youth are given useful roles, youth volunteers in the community and safety. In boundaries and expectations category the assets are family boundaries, school boundaries, neighborhood/community boundaries, adult role models, positive peer influence and high expectations. In the final category, constructive use of time the assets are creative and cultural activities, youth program, religious community and time at home.

Internal assets are divided in the categories of commitment to learning, positive values, social skills and positive identity. In the commitment of learning category the assets are achievement motivation, school engagement, homework, bonding to school and reading for pleasure. In the positive values category the assets are caring, equality and social justice, integrity, honesty, responsibility and restraint. In the social skills category the assets are planning and decision making, interpersonal skills, cultural competence, resistance skills and peaceful conflict resolution. In the final category, positive identity the assets are personal power, self-esteem, sense of purpose and positive view of personal future.

As parents and educators we can help by increasing the assets that children have. Children who have less than 20 assets are at risk for unhealthy behaviors such as alcohol/drug abuse, violence, depression and school problems. Children who have more assets will have healthy behaviors such as valuing diversity, succeeding in school, helping other, resisting danger and maintain a healthy lifestyle.
