## **Dimond Student Government Code of Ethics**

We hold all members of the Dimond Student Government to a high moral standard. Members are elected by the student body, and are therefore required to set a good example by exemplifying positive, appropriate behavior and by making good decisions. We are the leaders of the school and should behave accordingly.

All DHS Student Government members are expected to:

- 1. Attend all mandatory events at the designated times and places or contact the advisor to be excused.
- 2. Respect the rights and safety of others.
- 3. Abstain from the use of alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs at all times.
- 4. Fulfill the duties and responsibilities of an officer of the DHS Student Government as set forth in the Student Government Constitution and Bylaws.
- 5. Serve as a positive role model for a group of freshmen as a mentor in the Dimond Ignition Mentorship Program.
- 6. Follow the guidelines set forth in the Anchorage School District's current Student Handbook and Activities Handbook.
- 7. Maintain a 2.0 GPA at the conclusion of each semester.
- 8. Adhere to the Dimond Student Government Social Media Policy.

Violations of this Code could result in the student's removal from office, removal from the Student Government class and/or prohibition from future office at the discretion of the DHS Administration and the DHS Student Government Advisor, depending on the severity of the offense. If a member of Student Government receives an out-of-school suspension, they will be removed from Student Government for the remainder of the school year. If a member of Student Government receives an in-school suspension, they will be removed from their elected office. If a member of Student Government receives a second in-school suspension, they will be removed from Student Government for the remainder of the year.

We appreciate each officer's participation in DHS Student Government, and look forward to representing the student body within DHS, and DHS within the community. Like our motto, which states "Leadership is Action, Not Position," your signature below indicates that you have read and understand the above guidelines. ## **Dimond Student Government Social Media Policy**

Student Government members are role models and are expected to act with high moral character at all times. Members of Student Government are expected to comply with the following guidelines for use of social media at all times (24/7/365, starting from the time of filing to run for office). This applies to both personal social media accounts and official Student Government accounts

Students may not post text, images, videos, or other media that:

- 1. Shows themselves or other minors using alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs.
- 2. Harasses or bullies students, staff, or other individuals or groups.
- 3. Shows themselves or other students engaged in activities that are illegal or in violation of school, district, or ASAA rules.
- 4. Criticizes Student Government members or events.

In addition, students posting to official Student Government social media accounts may not:

- 1. Use the account for personal gain or recognition
- 2. Post, share, or retweet anything criticizing the school, administration, staff, or district
- 3. Post, share, or retweet anything promoting a particular political position, personal view or religion
- 4. Share the password to the account with anyone
- 5. Follow individual accounts of anyone from the official account
- 6. Follow group/organization accounts without advisor approval
- 7. Engage in arguments in the replies or comments to a post

In addition to potential consequences issued by the school, violations of these rules may result in one or more of the following, depending on the severity of the offense, as determined by the Student Government advisor and the school administration:

- Direction to remove/delete the offending post
- Probation in Student Government
- Removal from office
- Removal from Student Government class
- Prohibition from holding future Student Government office
