We will go outside up until the temperature reaches -10 degrees.

New COVID testing at Ptarmigan!

Ptarmigan Elementary and ASD have partnered with Beechtree Diagnostics to offer students COVID tests. The results come back to the family within 24 hours! All parents have to do is sign up! Here is how:

Sign up using this link or scan the QR code. https://beechtree.rymedi.com/#/registration-form?irbuuid=bdfc13af-f77b-4778-b666-feaa965a1360



- 1. While filling out the form, you do not have to add insurance information if you do not wish. Instead you can type "99999999"
- 2. When the registration form asks for an uploaded copy of ID or insurance card, you can simply upload a picture of the floor.
- 3. When you're finished, you will receive a unique QR code. No need to save this because the nurse can find it you when needing to test your child.
- 4. Test results should be sent to your phone or email within 24 hours. Please wait for negative test results before sending your student to school.

You will need to fill out a form for each student in your family. We would recommend having the form filled out ahead of time. That way, if your student comes to the nurse's office with COVID-like symptoms, they can be tested immediately without calling and waiting for parents/guardians to fill out the form.

If your student comes to the nurse's office with any COVID-like symptoms, they will be sent home, but as soon as your results are received (and if they are negative) and your student's symptoms are improving, they can return to school.

Please Note: The nurse is unable to test any student without the family filling out the form as this is the registration AND consent to test. Do not fill out the registration if you do not wish for your student to be tested for COVID at the school. With any COVID symptom a child is unable to return to school for 10 days OR they may return sooner with a negative COVID test.
