This collection of videos and activities highlights a handful of native cultures in the Americas and around the world.

#### For Kids Age 3-8

- "The Earth on Turtle's Back": Read this short story about our connection to nature and land.
- <u>Make Your Own Indigenous Fruits and Flowers</u>: These craft tutorials will show you how to turn things like paper and beads into Indigenous food plants like strawberries and sunflowers.
- Molly of Denali: Watch videos and play games based on the adventures of Molly, an Alaska Native girl.
- <u>Native Species Masks</u>: Download and color plants, animals, and elements found in Hawaiian rainforests.
- Storytime Videos: Listen to read-alouds of picture books with Indigenous characters and stories.
- "<u>Thunder Mountain/Snoozing Sun</u>": Watch an episode of <u>Spirit Rangers</u>, a children's show inspired by Native American folklore.

#### For Kids Age 9-12

- <u>The First Thanksgiving</u>: The history of Thanksgiving is different from the story that's often told. Read this article from *National Geographic Kids* to learn some myths and facts.
- <u>Hawaiian Watershed Adventure Game</u>: Print this fun board game and learn more about Hawaiian ecology.
- <u>Making Space History</u>: Listen to these inspiring words from astronaut Nicole Mann. She is a member of the Wailacki Tribe of the Round Valley Indian Tribes. She made history this year by becoming the first Native American woman in space.
- <u>"Remember" by Joy Harjo</u>: Check out this powerful poetry reading by Joy Harjo, U.S. poet laureate and writer of the Myskoke Nation.
- <u>The Story of Samoset, Massasoit, and Squanto</u>: Here's how three Indigenous men played a key role in the arrival of the Mayflower.
