If you are unable to print them off, students can still do many of the activities. We will be sharing an updated Remote

Learning Plan to include Zoom support sessions with your child's grade level cohort. Stay tuned!

I want to take this opportunity to thank our Noon Supervisors including our kindergarten paras. Being a noon supervisor is an incredibly challenging and vital position in schools. They keep our children safe and help them to make positive choices during the most unstructured part of their day. 
#### Valentine's Day Coming Soon


With Valentine's Day coming up, please look for communication from your student's teacher regarding how or if they will be celebrating. Please do not send in any food items without prior

### **School Policy Reminders**

Eagle River Elementary's policy for late drop-off is that families must come in and sign late

to the front office to sign students out. The office staff will not call students down before the authorized pick-up person is physically in the front office.

For late drop-off and early pick-up, the bus lane may be used from 9:30am to 3:00pm <u>only</u>. Families that use the bus lane after 3pm will be asked to relocate their vehicle before taking their student. We understand that the parking lot becomes congested in the afternoon and encourage families to plan accordingly and park in the empty lot across from the First Baptist Church on Monte after 3pm.

Lastly, cell phone use in the front office is strictly prohibited to maintain student confidentiality and FERPA regulations. Visitors using cell phones in the office will be asked to end their conversation or step into the vestibule to finish. We appreciate your understanding!

#### No Early Drop-off

We are need your help. We are working hard to accommodate our families by providing coverage at 8:35. Most schools are not providing supervision until 8:45. Please help us by waiting until 8:35 to let students out of your car.

When students are dropped off before 8:35am, this creates an unsafe environment for since we do not provide child care or supervision before school opens at 8:35am. Do not drop off your student until you see a staff member on duty with an orange vest at the stop sign AND it is 8:35. Our crossing guard sometimes goes out a few minutes early and some student get dropped off to go to the Y. When families see this they are letting students out of the car before there is coverage. If your child is lining up outside the front entry, they are here too early. This is especially important as the mornings get colder and darker.

#### **Volunteering for ERES**

If you would like to be considered for volunteer activities at Eagle River Elementary, please submit an application at <u>https://www.asdk12.org/Page/13771</u>. Once received online, applications take approx. 7-10 days to process. We highly encourage online applications as paper applications can take even longer and we will not be approving volunteer applications on site.

At this time, only approved volunteers, staff, and students (of course!) may enter the school past our front office. We will not be able to approve applications on site and last minute. Thank you families for your willingness to help out at our school!

#### Late Drop off and Early Pick Up Procedures

If you drop off your child late, you must come inside to the front office and sign them in. If you are picking your student up early, please do not call the office ahead of time. We will call your child down when you are in the front office. This prevents students from sitting in the front office waiting to be picked up.

You may park out front in the Bus Lane from 9:30-3:00 to pick up or drop off. Outside of these times, there is no parking in the bus lane. Please park in the parking lot.

\*Please plan ahead if you need to pick up your child early. Due to the number of students being picked up since we do not have busing, we are unable to call students out of classes after 3:15. Remember that you must have ID to pick up your student and you must be on the approved contact list.

#### **Arrival and Dismissal Procedures**

*Arrival* – Students will be let in at 8:35 and there will be no supervision until then. Students will not be allowed to wait before 8:35. Please time your child's arrival so they are here no earlier than 8:35. We appreciate your help with this so we can make sure students are supervised and safe!

- Student drop off will be at the stop sign at the front corner of the building and students will enter the front door. <u>Students will not be allowed to be dropped off until 8:35</u>
- All students enter through the front door
- Students will enter the building and sit on the floor outside their classrooms where they will be supervised by staff until the 8:50am (Kindergarten Students will sit in the front hallway)

#### Dismissal

- Car riders will be called by tag number from the MPR or classroom to the pick up lanes
- Walkers will be dismissed at the bell
- Tae Kwon Do and Bright Beginnings and Boys and Girls Club will be dismissed at the bell to wait at the front entry benches
- Student attending the Y go to the gym at the bell
- \* When we have bused Bus riders will sit in the Intermediate and Optional Hallways separated by bus numbers

• If bus is out front at dismissal, office will let staff know, otherwise students sit in hallway. Office will announce arrival of buses.

#### **Changes to How Your Child is Getting Home**

If you have a change to how your child is getting home for that day, please alert the front office as early as possible in the day. The end of the day is a hectic time and last minute changes are extremely difficult. Students being picked up from the front doors are considered walkers, and students being picked up in a car are considered car riders.

If you have a change to how your student is getting home that is long term, please make sure to let your child's teacher know.

#### **Attendance/Arrival Policy Reminders**

Many messages are left saying the student will be out but do not leave a reason. Without a reason, the student is automatically marked unexcused. When you know you will be on an extended absence like a family vacation, we can put a prearranged unexcused absence in the system so you do not get a daily phone call.

If you have any questions, please feel free to call the office at 742-3000.

When leaving an attendance message for your student please leave these important details:
1)Students Name
2)Date(s) of absence
3)Reason for absence
4)Teachers Name
5)Grade Level
6)If no reason is given it will always automatically be considered unexcused.

Please call the main line and press "1" for the attendance line if your child will be absent. Absences must be reported by 10:00am to ensure your student's attendance is entered. Families may also submit attendance requests through Q/Parent Connect. Automatic attendance calls alerting for unexcused absences go out at 10:45.

#### **ASD Attendance Guidelines**

Here are the District Guidelines for Attendance:

#### AM (starts at 9:00 am)

- Tardy up to 60 minutes after school starts
- Absent (.5 dav) If a student misses more than 60 minutes.

PM (starts at 12:15 pm)

- Tardy arrives at or before 1:15pm
- Absent (.5 day) student misses more than 60 minutes

### **Birthday Treats**

Please reach out to your child's teacher before sending/bringing in treats and they can fill you in on any classroom requirements including food allergies or sensitivities. Some teachers may prefer individually packaged items. In general, birthday treats must be store bought and pre-packaged (sealed store cupcakes for example).
