It's that time of year...science fair packets were sent home with all interested students. If your child didn't bring home a packet, and you want them to participate, please email Ms. April at lefevere_april@asdk12.org and we'll get you one. Any questions about the Science Fair can also be directed to the same email address.



Students can do a demonstration/research project or an experiment but REMEMBER, the entirety of the project is to be done at HOME. There are project examples and ideas in the packet. The packet also contains the requirements such as keeping a research notebook, the parts of the scientific method, interview questions, and a display board.

Students in grades K-3 will be Primary entries and students in grades 4-6 will be Intermediate entries.

Students should do the work themselves *with* support from adults. Setting up a plan with a schedule as to when each stage of the project should be completed would be a really great support.

The 2023 Science Fair Timeline:

March 6

ALL projects due AT school (Early and/or late submissions will not be accepted)

March 7

Fair Judging Day - students will present their projects and complete their interviews

March 8

Individual classes can sign up to walk through and look at all the projects
Family Night for STEM/Science Fair from 6:00 - 7:30 (activities, science fair, pizza)


March 9
