## **Moose Safety**

#### Parents—teach kids to Be KidSafe around moose:

- · Remember that moose are wild animals
- · Don't scream and run
- · Never get between a mother moose and its calf

#### Stay away from moose:

- Keep at least 100 feet away (2 houses) from any moose and twice as far from one with a calf
- · Get behind something big if a moose comes toward you
- Avoid moose: go back home, to school, to the nearest Safe Home or find a different, safe walking route
- · Don't try to pet or feed moose
- · Don't throw snowballs or objects at moose

#### Signs of a moose ready to attack:

It dashes around, its ears go down, it will lick its lips, and the hair goes
up on the back of its neck. You are too close if you can see all this!



#### Winter is here!

Winter has charged us like a bull here in the Girdwood valley and this past November and December were the snowiest on record. Every day students are coming in to borrow gloves, snowpants, and boots from the nurse because they forgot theirs at home. She only has so much to loan out. This is another reminder to please make sure your child comes to school with the right clothing every day: winter coat, snow pants, boots, gloves, and any other outdoor clothing they would need to keep them warm and dry during recess. All students have outdoor recess everyday except in cases of extreme inclement weather, so they need to be prepared. Older kids should be dressed for the weather, also. Please send your child to school with appropriate gear, regardless of what is happening outside when they leave in the morning. Remember to label **ALL GEAR** that they may become separated from. As part of The Alaska Reads Act, the State of Alaska requires that districts administer an early literacy screening tool three times a year to students in grades K-3 to identify potential reading difficulties in order to improve reading outcomes for students. Assessments is the State of Alaska
Department of Education's and ASD's Early
Literacy benchmark screening and progress
monitoring tool for students in grades K-3 in
reading. mClass utilizes curriculum-based
measures and is used by schools as part of
the ASD Comprehensive Assessment System
to support informed instructional decisions.
The Alaska Department of Education &
Early Development explains the decision to
adopt mClass as the statewide literacy


