Note from the Principal

Dear Girdwood PK-8 School Families,

Happy Holidays! It is hard to believe we are in the final month of 2024, and we are almost done with the second quarter of the school year! We hope you all join us for our PTA Holiday Bazaar this Saturday, December 7th, from 12-4 pm, and our Primary Holiday Concert on December 12th. Both events are sure to bring you some holiday cheer! Our community is amazing and gives so much during this time of year! We have many programs that reflect Girdwood's caring community culture. Our students will soon be gathering canned food for our annual canned food drive that helps support local families. We will also continue our Angel Tree and hope you will reach out to brighten the holiday season for local families.

We are looking for parents to join us during our PTA meetings. Our next PTA meeting is at the Girdwood Brewing Company on Tuesday, December 10th, starting at 6:30 pm. We typically meet in the back room. The more the merrier! Please consider joining us. We would really like to see some new faces to join us with new ideas. That being said, we are so grateful for all the hard work our current PTA puts into making our school community a great place to learn and have fun.

During the month of December, we are completing our winter MAP Benchmark Assessment in math and English language arts for grades 3-6 this week and mClass testing for students in grades K-3 Monday, 12/9. These are assessments that help us determine if students are making adequate progress. These tests are given three times a year to see how students are progressing. A large part of students making adequate growth is through good attendance in school. Please make sure that your children are in school unless they are ill. The goal for each student is to be in school 90% of the school year. That means students can only miss approximately 17 days of the entire year to reach this goal. A high attendance rate is important because students are more likely to succeed in academic and social skills when they attend school consistently. It is difficult for their teacher and the class to build their skills and progress if a large number of students are frequently absent.

Just a few reminders for all:

- Keep up with your child's grades and assignments through accessing Q Parent Connect at any time. Do you know how to login to Q? If not, give our front office a call at 742-5300 to get your login and password.
- Winter is here! Please send your student to school with appropriate gear and clothing. We go outside everyday rain or shine unless the temperatures are below negative 10 degrees.

Students begin winter break on December 20th and return to school on January 6th. I hope you all have an excellent holiday season and winter break!

The only exception is when students remain to participate in school or FVCS supervised activities. Playground closures immediately following school to ensure a smooth and safe transition are a standard policy with elementary schools across our school district. Thank you for your support in keeping our students safe and for your understanding.







Help Your Child Succeed in School: **Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early**

DID YOU KNOW?


- Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just 1 or 2 days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences and tardiness can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Eventually good attendance will be a skill that will help them succeed in high school and college.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- · Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- · Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your children to their teachers and classmates before school starts.
- Develop backup plans for getting to school if something comes up.
 Call on a family member, a neighbor or another parent.
- Try to schedule non-Covid-19 related medical appointments and extended trips when school isn't in session.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors and other parents for advice on how to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- If you are concerned that your child may have Covid-19, call your school for advice.
- If your child must stay home due to illness or quarantine, ask the teacher for resources and ideas to continue learning at home.

Parent Volunteers

One of the best things about Girdwood School is how active our families are within our classrooms and school. We greatly appreciate all your help and hope to continue this partnership. We strongly suggest ALL parents complete the ASD online volunteer application asap, as well as complete the parent driver paperwork in the front office. If you plan to do any of the following, you will need to complete the online volunteer application: assist teachers in prepping for a project, being a chaperone, classroom volunteer, field trip volunteer, PTA volunteer, reading tutor, science fair judge, special events or project volunteer, and library helper. Basically, if you plan on helping out at any function or volunteering in any format, you will need to complete the ASD online application at least 7 days prior to volunteering in the school or for a school event. In regard to parent drivers, we will no longer be able to accept paper applications a few days prior to or the day of a field trip. The parent driver paperwork will need to be completed at school in the front office. All parent driver paperwork will need to be completed at least 10 days in advance of all field trips. The front office staff will need a copy of your driver's license, proof of auto insurance, and registration. We look forward to working with you and appreciate your kindness and help this school year!

Sign up to receive text message alerts from our school

Parents and community members can sign up to receive SMS text messages from ASD or our school. ASD will use this service to communicate school closure information and general district news. Our school uses this service to share news and updates with families. Additionally, ASD's Transportation Department will send a text message when school buses are more than 20 minutes late.

Text messages will only be sent to people who opt-in to receive texts. Users can opt-out at any time. This service is not intended to replace existing communications, but rather help enhance them.

ASD's vendor, School Messenger, does not charge for the text messages users will receive, However, wireless providers may charge for individual text messages depending on the plan associated with a person's phone. mClass Winter Benchmark ELA Assessment Family Information

As part of The Alaska Reads Act, the State of Alaska requires that districts administer an early literacy screening tool three times a year to students in grades K-3 to identify potential reading difficulties in order to improve reading outcomes for students. Families can read more about this comprehensive K-3 reading policy at The Alaska Reads Act website: education.alaska.gov/akreads. mClass with DIBELS 8th Edition Assessments is the State of Alaska Department of Education's and ASD's Early Literacy benchmark screening and progress monitoring tool for students in grades K-3 in reading. mClass utilizes curriculum-based measures and is used by schools as part of the ASD Comprehensive Assessment System to support informed instructional decisions. The Alaska Department of Education & Early Development explains the decision to adopt mClass as the statewide literacy screener at the following website: https://education.alaska.gov/Alaska-Reading-Resources/Statewide-Early-Literacy-Screener. mClass screening assessments will be administered in-person at Girdwood School to our K-3 students on 12/9/24. Results for K-3 students that were assessed during a benchmark window, will be available in Parent Connect after winter break. Emergency Response

The Anchorage School District (ASD) is committed to ensuring the safety and security of our students, staff, and visitors. Take a moment to review this guide to ensure you are prepared in the event of an emergency situation at school. ASD follows the response protocols established by the ASD School Board. School and district staff train yearly on emergency protocols and situation management and students take part in drills throughout each school year.

Actions in an emergency



"Stay Put" is ordered when there is an issue INSIDE/OUTSIDE the building. Police activity in the area, a wild animal nearby, or a medical incident are all common causes. Everyone returns inside the building, exterior doors are locked and "business as usual" generally continues inside the school.



LOCKDOWN is ordered when there is an issue OUTSIDE the building, most often police activity in the area that could pose an imminent threat, such as a weapon or unstable individual. All interior/exterior doors will remain locked until the 'all clear' is given.



Ordered when there is a threat INSIDE the building. Students and staff will use ALICE Protocols. Do NOT call staff/ students during an active threat. Parents are not allowed on site during Stayput/Lockdown/Active threat (ALICE).

ACTIVE THREAT



Ordered when people must exit the building due to unsafe circumstances such as fire, gas leak, or building damages. If student pick-up or off-site reunification is required, instructions will be communicated by the district.



Ordered when personal protection is necessary from dangerous weather conditions such as a gas leak, blizzard, or hail. May also be ordered in the event of a hazmat situation in the area.

SHELTER IN PLACE

Please note: some situations may require a combination of actions above.

Examples of school actions

Severe weather - Schools may **Shelter in Place** until weather passes; could delay release of students at end of day until safe to exit building.

Fire or Hazmat Situation in the Area - Evacuation or Shelterin Place, depending on location and severity of fire/hazmat issue.

Threat of Violence or Weapon on a Person - ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate), LOCKDOWN (exterior threat), or Evacuation, depending on the situation.

Intruder - Requires an immediate Lockdown or ALICE. Police Activity in the Area - Lockdown or Stay Put may be called for by any staff member at the school.

What do I need to know and do?

- If you're at a school and an emergency occurs, follow protocol with students and staff.
- We know families want information right away. Experience
 has taught us that initial information is almost always
 incorrect. Please know, our security and administrative staff
 are working hard to determine what the real situation is and
 will communicate with families as soon as information is
 verified as accurate and next actions have been determined.
- Do not call the school or security staff, as they are working on the situation and ensuring your student's safety. Do not go to the school; this may interfere with procedures. Only public safety personnel will be allowed in/near a school during an emergency situation.
- We understand you may want to communicate with your student during an emergency, however, please refrain from calling; it may prevent him/her hearing important, possibly life-saving, instructions.
- It is vital parents and guardians keep their information updated in ASDConnect. We will utilize email, text messaging, and phone calls to communicate with you.
- The fastest way to get information in an emergency situation is to follow us on Twitter and Facebook (@ASD_Info). It is our first and fastest means of getting messages out. Also, check our website for alerts on the homepage.





Moose Safety

Parents—teach kids to Be KidSafe around moose:

- Remember that moose are wild animals
- · Don't scream and run
- Never get between a mother moose and its calf

Stay away from moose:

- Keep at least 100 feet away (2 houses) from any moose and twice as far from one with a calf
- Get behind something big if a moose comes toward you
 Avoid moose: go back home, to school, to the nearest Safe Home or find a different, safe walking route
- Don't try to pet or feed moose
 Don't throw snowballs or objects at moose

Signs of a moose ready to attack:

 It dashes around, its ears go down, it will lick its lips, and the hair goes up on the back of its neck. You are too close if you can see all this!





Rain Gear, Lost and Found, and Reflective Gear Reminder

Please encourage your child to bring their rain/ snow gear to school every day. As hardy Alaskans we go out for recess in just about any weather so our students can get some exercise and let out some energy. Remember, we do live in a rain forest, so it's not always snowing but sometimes raining in winter. Please make sure their winter gear is waterproof.

When stopping by the school, please check out our lost and found located in the mini-commons for gear that your child might be missing. Please label all belongings. We have black and silver Sharpies in the office for anyone to borrow, if needed.

We are still losing minutes of daylight every day and it's dark in the morning when they get here. Please encourage your child to wear reflective clothing and remind oneself to slow down when driving during these times when students are going to school. We want to ensure all of Girdwood kiddos and community members are safe.
