

Prerequisite Skills

At the beginning of the year, your child should be able to...

- Follow directions
- Hold scissors & pencil appropriately
- Correctly count at least 5 objects
- Sort objects according to their size, shape or color
- Understand directional words such as up, down, over, under and beside



Future Content Skills

Next year, your child will...

- Compare numbers to 100
- Understand 1s and 10s
- Understand the ones and tens place in a number
- Skip count by 5s and 10s
- Measure lengths using nonstandard measures (blocks, paper clips, etc.)
- Quickly and accurately add and subtract with numbers that total 10 or less
- Solve number stories using words and pictures with numbers to 100
- Create and read bar graphs

- Counting and sequencing numbers by 1s and 10s to 100.
