ASD Return to School Update

ASD Back-in-School

Key Points

- The plan prioritizes elementary school students returning first because of their challenges with online remote instruction.
- The plan addresses equity concerns by identifying students who may need extra support in middle school and high school.
- The plan allows the District and community to build confidence in the mitigation protocols and provides time to make adjustments while phasing students back into schools.
- Prioritizing in-person school for small groups of students who need additional support will reduce some of the need for summer school and keep more students on track for graduation.
- ASD Virtual will remain an option for all grade levels.
- The District will continue making announcements around the 1st and 15th of each month.

Mears Families,

This week, middle and high schools throughout ASD have reopened their doors to small groups of students for in-person support and instruction. While the majority of students in the district are generally showing success while learning online, the students selected for the small in-school programs have demonstrated a need for additional support.

At Mears, we are excited to welcome back a cohort of about 35 students, who were invited to attend based on meeting certain criteria. Due to ongoing safety mitigation efforts and the need to continue to staff Mears' robust online educational program, staffing for the in-school program is limited. Therefore, Mears in-school program will remain small and focused on those students who have already been selected.



10-Point Panther Path of Safety

- 1 When on the Mears campus, keep your mask on at all times.
- 2 Maintain 6 feet of distance between yourself and your fellow students.
- 3 Please always walk the one direction indicated by the hallway arrows.
- 4 Do not gather or socialize in the hallways: go directly to your class each period.
- 5 Do not touch your face.
- 6 Frequently wash your hands and use hand sanitizer.
- Request to use the restroom and place your restroom marker outside.
- 8 Lockers will not be used.
- No guests in the building: students and staff only.
- Be safe for yourself and others.

The small in-school program at Mears will support students, while at the same time allow school personnel the opportunity to fine tune safety protocols and build community confidence as we prepare for a broader reopening of school at the beginning of 4th quarter on March 15.





CARES Act Voucher (Gift Card) Program Application

Introduction

The Voucher Program is made possible through CARES Act funding from the Municipality of Anchorage. This program will provide vouchers to individuals and/or families living within the municipality to help them with certain daily expenses such as groceries, diapers, medication, gasoline, etc. The vouchers will be made up of non-transferable gift cards from local participating stores that can be redeemed for those daily expenses. You will receive one voucher per address with the exception of those living in a residential program that requires sharing a physical address. Households including minor children are eligible for an increased benefit.

Recently Updated: ASD's Health and Safety Covid Matrix

ASD's planning and decision-making process for determining the District's risk level for conducting school takes multiple community factors into consideration. The District conducts this process in close conversation with the <u>Municipality of Anchorage</u> and the State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services.

In recent months, organizations such as the <u>Center for Disease Control</u>, the <u>American Academy of Pediatrics</u>, and the <u>World Health</u> <u>Organization</u> have expanded their guidance and resources regarding safely providing public education. This new information includes a range of metrics and other criteria that allows districts, in close coordination with state and local health officials, to revise and adapt school opening guidelines based on the unique context of their community.
