Students Excel: 60% with GPAs of 3.0 and Higher



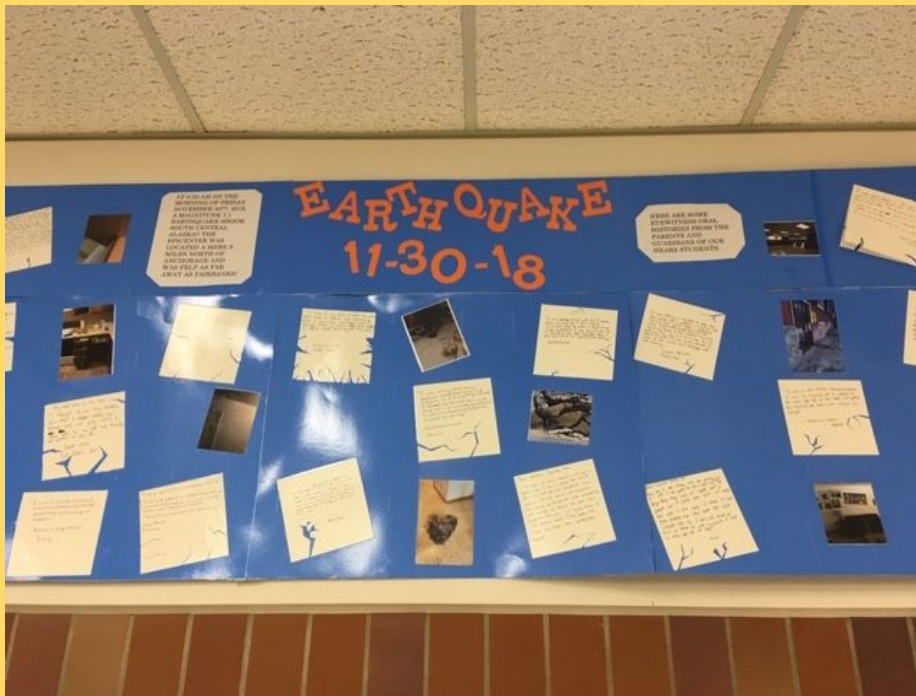
Over the last two weeks, Mears has distributed Honor Roll certificates to celebrate students' strong academic achievement for the first quarter of the year. Students were recognized for achieving cumulative GPAs of 3.0-3.9 and for GPAs of 4.0. An impressive number of students made Honor Roll. A total of 232 (63%) 7th graders and 222 (58%) of 8th graders received certificates. Such achievement by so many students speaks volumes about Mears' incredible students and the amazing team of educators who support and guide them. Go Panthers!

Social Studies Revisits Earthquake to Explore Primary Source Documents



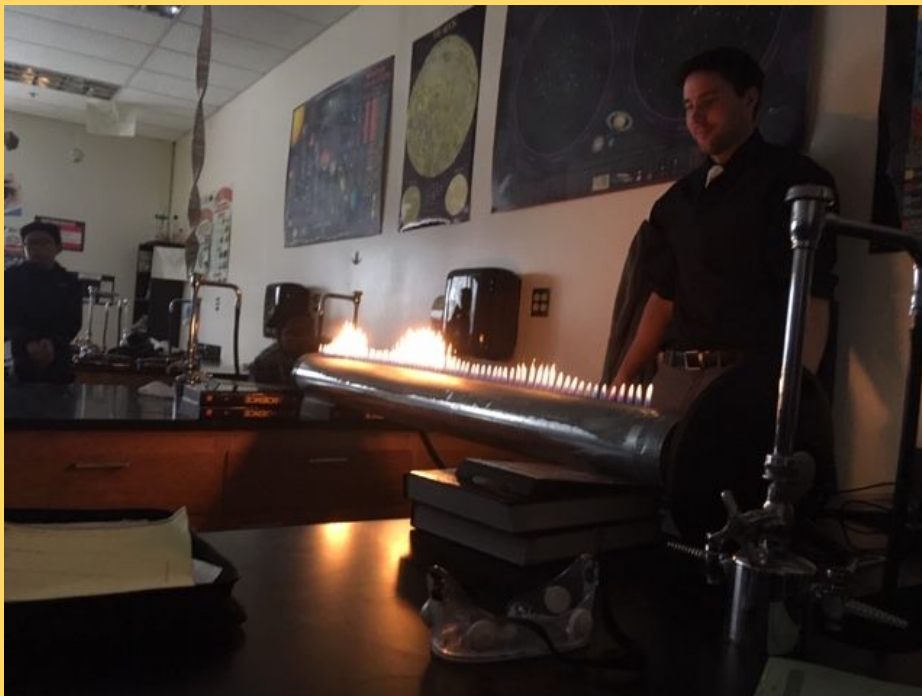

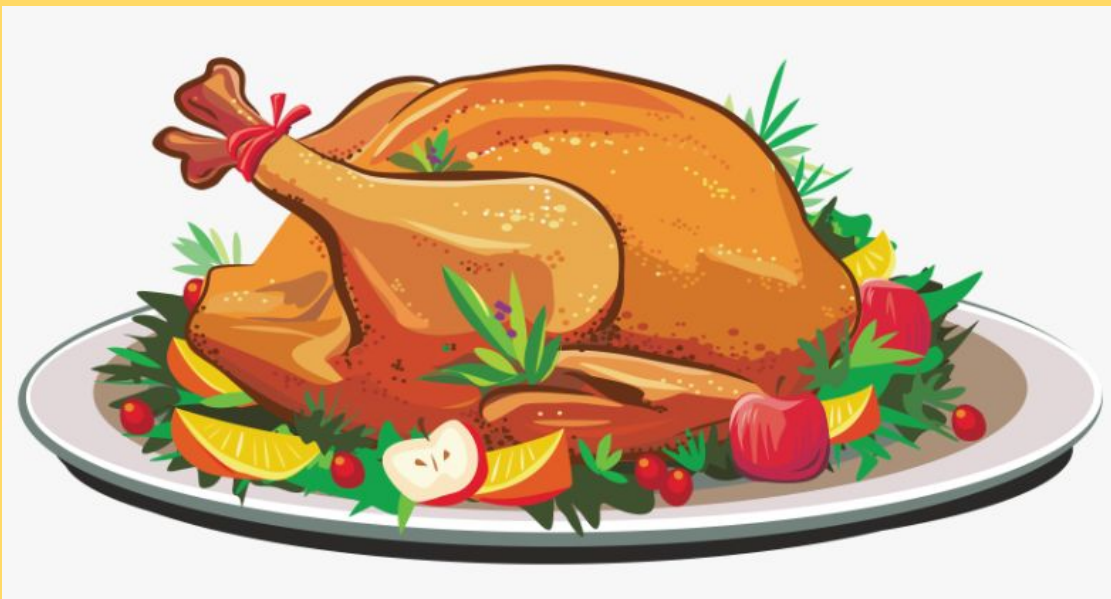

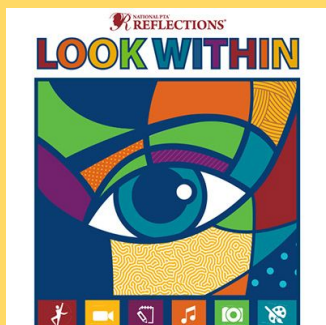
