Please note that student drop-off and pick-up zones will not change once busing resumes. Parents may continue with the routines they have already established.


All Mears busses #80-87 will run during Cohort 3. See below for Cohort bussing schedule:






Archery - Three amazing archers!

BENEFITS OF FLU VACCINATION

- Getting a flu shot is more important than ever, but it does not protect against COVID-19
 It's especially important if you have heart
- disease, diabetes, pulmonary or other chronic diseases, are pregnant,
- immunocompromised or over 50. The vaccine may make your illness milder if
- you do get sick. Flu vaccination may reduce the risk of serious flu outcomes, like hospitalization.

VACCINE INFORMATION

- The standard and high doses are quadrivalent: designed to protect against four different viruses.
- They do not contain latex or thimerosal.
- The high dose vaccine (for people 65+) will NOT be available at the drive-thrus.
- There are many flu viruses. The vaccine protects against those believed to be most common and is updated each year.
- You cannot get the flu from the vaccine
